Steps

When we were children we took small steps, unsure and uncertain of our abilities to walk, often stumbling, and sometimes hurting ourselves when falling. But we got up and we persevered, and eventually we gained our confidence and walked without effort and thought.

Through life, we often have to take small steps in our learning, relationships and planning for the future. Small steps help us learn new job roles and life responsibilities and literally everything in life which is new to us. Sometimes these steps have to be taken rapidly so that we can achieve our own goals and the expectations of others, this rush can often be successful, but it is also

fraught with danger.

Sometimes there is a temptation to rush into situations when we are eager to move on, or when we are overly confident in our abilities, or when our assessment of a situation is flawed.
And at those times, when we 'come
a cropper' when our abilities do not
match the requirements of a problem
or situation, we stumble and fall, not
as the child, but our confidence takes a pounding, our ego is dented, and is experienced, ridicule follows when others thought we should have known better.

There is much to be said about small steps, even Neil Armstrong, the first man to walk on the moon, mentioned "one small step" as he touched the lunar surface for the very first time. At times when we realise we need help we are hesitant to even acknowledge that need, when we do acknowledge it, we seek help, and when we are confident that the help found is just what we are looking for, we want to rush forward, confident in the support we receive. But as mentioned earlier, rushing in is not always as simple as it seems.

It is often wiser to be sure of the situation and certain in our abilities before we rush in to any situation. Sometimes I have to stop clients rushing ahead too quickly, because every journey needs small steps. If we leap ahead, some of those small developing anead, some of those small developing progressive steps are missed, and that leads to familiarity being missed, uncertainty being felt in the future, and eventually the individual would have to re-trace their steps, find what they are missing and then take those steps which provide the necessary firm foundation of knowledge and familiarity for the future, they are in effect set-back by their initial decision to leap ahead. 

Residents lose fight to save historic pub

NEIGHBOURS have failed in a battle to prevent demolition of a historic Warrington pub.

Borough planning bosses have given the go-ahead for a housing development that will mean demolition of the Locally Listed Hermit Inn, in Golborne Road, Hermitage Green, Winwick.

The pub is believed to date from around 1839, although it is thought to have been modified or extended at least seven times between 1849 and 2005.

It has been closed for some time and is in a deteriorating condition following attacks by vandals and a

disastrous fire in March last year.

Members of the borough council's development management committee were told it is believed only the cellars remain intact from the original structure.

Neighbours argued that demolishing the pub and building 12 new houses on the site would damage the Green Belt, create traffic problems and contribute further to an oversupply of housing

in the Warrington area.

They claimed the proposed dwellings are too large and out of character with the area and would also have a damaging impact on bungalows in adjacent Gerosa Avenue.

Planning officers recommended the scheme be approved. They accepted that Hermitage Green lay within a historic landscape and there was evidence that a village was established there by at viriage was established there by at least the 18th century. But it was not thought the pub pre-dated the Victorian period.

They also accepted that residential development would normally be inappropriate within the Green Belt, but pointed out that it could be justified for limited infilling or redevelopment

previously developed sites.
The old pub was now considered to be unsafe and unsightly.



Third firm signs up for Omega

A THIRD occupier has been signed up for the giant Omega development site at Warrington.

Builders' merchants Travis Perkins have agreed to take a 700,000 sq ft logistics centre on Omega North subject to planning permission.

The announcement comes just over a week after Hermes was

announced as the second occupier for Omega North following the December announcement about Brakes as the first.

Sutherland, Andrew joint Miller Director of Managing

Developments, a partner of Omega Warrington Ltd (OWL) said: "The level of occupier success we have achieved at Omega North since Christmas is unprecedented throughout not only the North West but the whole of the UK.

"The fact that, subject to planning being granted, we have only two

small sites left on Omega North demonstrates that we have now created a major logistics hub in the North West."

The two sites left on Omega North are 2.9 acres close to junction 8 on the M62 motorway trontage, and 3.2 acres next to

Both sites are capable of meeting requirements for 50,000 sq ft of logistics accommodation.

If planning consent is granted, OWL will be building Travis Perkins a freehold "turn-key" unit of 630,000 sq ft on the ground floor with 70,000sq ft at mezzanine level.

Work is expected to start around the middle of the year, with completion around the middle of next year.

NINETY six per cent of properties in Warrington, Halton and Cheshire will get access to high-speed fibre broadband over the next three years, in a £28.5m deal between four councils and BT.

Ashley was chosen to represent the UK at the Skills Olympics after finishing second in an International Competition Denmark in January.



Partnership - made up of Warrington, Halton, Cheshire East and Cheshire West and Chester councils, has secured funding to provide additional rural broadband infrastructure to more than 80,000

This will build on BT's on-going commercial investment in fibre

across the county.

As a result, more than 400,000 premises should have access to broadband speeds of up to 80Mbps by the end of 2016.

Uplift

Those premises in the remaining four per cent that currently experience low speeds will also see an uplift, as the project aims to deliver a minimum of 2Mbps or more to almost all homes and businesses.

The project will transform broadband speeds across Cheshire, narrowing the gap between speeds in urban and rural

According to Ofcom, the county's average downstream speed is currently around 11Mbps, while about 12 per cent of the population receive less than 2Mbps.

The investment will boost the

local economy and help to create or protect local jobs. A recent study for Cheshire,

Warrington and Halton estimated that full coverage of superfast broadband would generate a gross impact of £1.3 billion in gross value added over 15 years and create 11,500 jobs, with a further £330m of economic benefits to households.

BT was awarded the contract following a procurement exercise through the Government's Broadband Delivery framework.

The company is contributing £9m towards fibre deployment in "non-commercial" areas, while the Connecting Cheshire Partnership is contributing £1.85m, with a further £4m coming from the Government's BDUK funds and £13.6m from European Regional Development

Openreach, BT's local network division, will now start the work on the ground with engineers surveying locations around the county and analysing the best way to roll out the network.

This initial survey work will take about eight months, so Connecting Cheshire should be in a position to announce which communities will be included in the first stage of the roll-out by December.



World first as Dave goes the Extra Mile!

DISABILITY campaigner Dave Thompson has completed a world first during a one mile scuba dive challenge to raise funds for charity.

Dave, (below) who only has the use of one arm after breaking his neck playing American football, has completed a Scuba Challenge in aid of Warrington Disability Partnership using a special new rebreather system - and is believed to be the first disabled person in the world to use the new equipment.

He was able to complete the challenge at Sankey Leisure centre without the need to change his air tanks.

Dave, who is Chairman of the charity he was a founder member of, completed the challenge supported by Terry Wood and his team from Cheshire Scuba Academy who provided support and equipment.

Dave swam one mile underwater, despite being a full time wheelchair user since 1989, with limited use in his left arm, and none in his right arm and legs.

He was joined by friends and colleagues including fellow diver Dave Williams.

The new rebreather system which Dave successfully used, was previously reserved for deep diving enthusiasts and military divers. But now UK company 'Poseidon' has brought rebreathers to the recreational sports diving market. Originally designed for NASA space adventures the system provides safer diving with less risk of decompression sickness, no bubbles and it is quieter to allow one to experience the marine life up close.



An end to the high street solicitor?

In April the government published a consultation paper which makes proposals for sweeping changes in the provision of publicly funded criminal defence services.

The Ministry of Justice (MoJ) intends to introduce a tendering process which will involve the submission of bids to provide services at a fixed price for different types of work, for instance police station advice and attendance and magistrates court representation.

The winners of the bid process will be given an equal share of the publicly funded work in a particular criminal justice area. In Cheshire there will be 9 contracts awarded entitling the successful bidders to a 1/9th share of the work for a three year period initially. The consultation process is due to end on 4 June and the tender applications will begin in October with contracts to be awarded in September 2014.

This process will remove the majority of firms from the market because there will not be enough contracts to allow most of the existing providers to practice and it will be impossible for most firms to tender at a price which will allow their businesses to remain viable. Therefore practices which have been built up over decades will disappear and many jobs and a wealth of knowledge and experience will be lost.

There are two particularly controversial aspects to the tendering scheme. Firstly the right to choose a solicitor, which is currently enshrined in the government's own recent legislation (the Legal Aid, Sentencing and Punishment of Offenders Act 2012, s27(4)), will be removed. Secondly organisations which have no previous experience of providing criminal defence services will be invited to join in the process. Stobart Group,

most famous for the Eddie Stobart haulage brand and 'a national leader in multimodal logistics' according to its website, has expressed an interest in bidding for contracts. It is likely that the MoJ will welcome such interest. These proposals along with the changes to family legal aid and personal injury work pose a real threat to the future of high street solicitors.

Criminal defence practitioners do not spend all of their time representing hardened criminals. Many law abiding citizens have teenage children who end up in a police station and will need proper advice given that the consequences could profoundly affect their future. Returns deadline has passed

By the time you read this then the deadline of 19th May (17th May this year as the tax office do not believe in working weekends) for submitting End of Year P14s and P35s will have passed.

These returns are required if you have any employees. Hopefully, if this applies to you then you will have met the deadline. If not then have met the deadline. It not then the bad news is you will now be facing a penalty of at least £100. Penalties are calculated at £100 per month or part of month for up to 50 employees, with larger penalties for larger employers.

However, this is not the end of the penalty season for employers to make

This must be done by 6th July. There is a period of grace, but if the return is not received by 19th July then penalties will be payable. These penalties are similarly £100 per month or part of month for up to 50 employees. Again, increased penalties apply for larger employers. These penalties are automatic and will be applied in all cases where

will be applied in all cases where returns are due but not received by the due date. In their guidance the the due date. In their guidance the tax office state that they will send reminders out to all employers to remind them of these requirements. However, if you do not receive a reminder, even if this is due to a failure by the tax office to act on information given to them such as a change of address, then this will not be accepted as an excuse. be accepted as an excuse.



This could apply, for instance, if you have operated a PAYE scheme at some point in the past and cannot remember receiving written confirmation from the tax office that it has been closed. Penalty



notices will be issued in all cases where the tax office consider that returns are due. Even if the penalties are later cancelled receiving a letter demanding payment of £900 or even more can be traumatic.
