#### Parr Hall is the tops!

WARRINGTON'S Parr Hall has been recognised as one of the best live music venues in the country at the annual Music Week awards.

It was the only venue in the North West to be nominated in the "Live Music Venue" category and only lost out to the O2 Arena in London - formerly known as the Millennium

The Music Week awards celebrate and recognise the finest commercial and creative successes in the UK music industry.

Although comparatively small for a music venue, Parr Hall has a strong history of hosting big name bands, including the Rolling Stones, The Who, Arctic Monkeys and The Courteeners to name a few.

More recently The Stone Roses chose Parr Hall for their first live performance in 16 years.

Other recent big music performances include Beady Eye's only UK headline show last year, which featured Liam Gallagher's band playing Oasis' songs for the very first time, and Miles Kane warmed up for his V Festival appearance at the venue.

Venue manager, Chris Persoglio said: "I'm absolutely thrilled that we were recognised as one of the best music venues in the UK. It's all down to the dedication, commitment and passion of the staff. They ensure that each and every performance held at Parr Hall reaches its full potential which is recognised by touring personnel across the country and is the reason that national promoters return time and again".

#### Rock legend rolls back the years

Concert Review - Michael Schenker's Temple of Rock, Warrington Parr Hall, Sunday 14 April 2013

ROCK legend Michael Schenker rolled back the years at Warrington Parr Hall.

The guitarist known as the "mad axeman" came to prominence as a guitar player with the Scorpions and UFO in the seventies. During the eighties he led the Michael Schenker Group where he cemented his reputation as one of the finest guitarists of his generation. Lineup changes, legal shuffles and well documented substance abuse sidelined him for much of the nineties before he stepped back into the limelight to celebrate MSG's 25th Anniversary in 2005. Today Michael Schenker is a changed man clean, lean and sober.

The reinvigorated guitarist brought his "Temple of Rock" tour to Warrington's Parr Hall for a blistering night of hard rock. From the opening Scorpion's track "Lovedrive" to the

set closing UFO number "Doctor Doctor", the 58 year old Schenker belied his age and didn't hold back from delivering a crowd pleasing twenty song set filled with classics from his long career. In front of a Marshall stack, and swapping periodically between a selection of four custom Dean Flying Vs, Schenker looked blissfully happy as he prowled across the front of the stage, crouched over his guitar and scanning the audience and slapping outstretched hands. Backed slapping outstretched hands. Backed by former Scorpions rhythm section, Herman Rarebell ,drums Francis Bucholz, bass, guitarist/keyboardist Wayne Findley and vocalist Doogie White the band delivered a powerful performance.

Standout numbers were "Only You Can Rock Me", "Rock You like A Hurricane", "Lights Out" and an immense version of "Rock Bottom".

Support came from young power trio Virgil & The Accelerators whose riff laden blues rock went down well with the crowd.

A NUMBER of major firms are set to sign up for sites on Warrington's flagship development site, Omega.

This was revealed as regional dignitaries, stakeholders and private sector partners gathered at Omega to celebrate the progress of work on premises for the first occupier on the £1 billion site.

The final steel sheets were laid down to complete the roof of a

down to complete the roof of a new 200,000 sq ft state-of-the art logistics centre for grocery and fresh food suppliers Brakes. The depot will operational by the

end of the year, bringing hundreds of jobs to the area.

According to Andrew Sutherland, joint managing director of Miller Developments - a partner in Omega Warrington Ltd - it is just the start of things to come.

He said: "We are very happy to be celebrating the fact that the Omega project is now firmly underway. We are all committed to building on this first success to enable the wider project to become a strong commercial reality, and a

a strong commercial reality, and a magnet for investment in the North West.

"This first deal has been a crucial kick-start to the scheme as it includes a £7m infrastructure contract for an access road and associated services that is now opening up Omega North to make this far more attractive for further investment logistics occupiers.

#### MP shows support for groundbreaking work

A WARRINGTON based clinical hypnotherapist has received the backing of his local MP on his groundbreaking work, which could help save the NHS money.

absenteeism from work or school, bringing higher costs to employers, students miss college and later, university classes and younger children miss school, sabotaging their education. And after a year or so of ineffective treatment, the medical investigations may start again, and so the expensive cycle continues.

IBS is not classified as a serious condition that can result in death, but medical experts agree that the Quality of life (Qol.) of an IBS sufferer is restricted to varying degrees, dependent upon the frequency and presentation of the IBS symptoms.

researched that clinical hypnotherapy can significantly decrease the symptoms and frequency of IBS.

people auditioned nationwide, and Phoebe was one of just 36 girls to be selected


She will be part of the cast for the new musical OMG: Ovid unplugged, to be performed in Halifax in August.

#### Fond farewell to Wally Barnes

WELL-known ghost story writer and charity champion Wally Barnes, who died aged 88, was given a fond farewell at his funeral at Warrington Crematorium.

Wally, aged 88 from Bewsey, Warrington, wrote a collection of books over the years in which he claimed Warrington was "the most ghost infested town in the country'

He also wrote a book about the infamous "Battle of Burtonwood" when American troops clashed with allies.

He was a popular speaker entertaining adults and children throughout the town and was extremely proud of his time as a chef in the Royal Parachute Regiment.

His daughter Karol Rogers said life in the family home was always interesting and he often told stories and encouraged people to write. He was so popular that one local man formed a Wally Barnes

Appreciation Society.
Wally, of Delves Avenue, was

married to Winnie and the couple have three children Karol, Wally and Edward.

Wally was also well known locally for fundraising and raised money for a variety of local causes.
He died on March 31 after being taken ill while staying with family in Wales.

In the absence of the Assembly's First Minister, Peter Robinson [Democratic Unionist Party] and Deputy First Minister, Martin McGuinness [Sinn Fein] their the Assembly's MLA's about how the Foundation and the Council were marking the 20th anniversary of the IRA bombing of Warrington. We updated them on the ways in which the Foundation's work has developed since the mid 90s to 2005, when the volume of our Anglo-Irish work diminished partly as a result of the Peace

The visit gave us an opportunity to tell

diminished partly as a result of the Peace Process and also because the focus of our work shifted to the impact and threat presented by the emergence and actions of young and extreme British Muslims, 4 of whom attacked tube trains and a bus in London killing 52 innocent people.

The reception we received from our colleagues in the Assembly was very warm and very complimentary, with many acknowledging that Warrington's pain and suffering had been pivotal in producing a major shift Irish public opinion.

One of the striking aspects of political life at Stormont is how the once extraordinary has become ordinary. It is no longer a big deal that relatives of IRA victims are chatting to Sinn Fein politicians.

The once unthinkable has become relatively routine. The peace process is by no means perfect, and powersharing is still a work in progress, but Stormont is stable. Step by step, the barriers are coming down.



#### 20th Anniversary of the Warrington Bombing



Hundreds of people observed a minute's silence as 20 peace doves were released at a moving civic event to mark the 20th anniversary of the Warrington bombing. On March 20 1993, an IRA bomb exploded killing 12 year old Tim Parry and three-year-old Johnathan Ball and injuring a further 54 other people.

Survivors of the bombing were joined by family members and friends, victims of 7/7 bombings in London, Mike Penning, Minister of State for Northern Ireland, Alderman William Leathem, the Mayor of Lisburn, local dignitaries and community representatives.

After the silent reflection, Colin Parry said: "20 years ago two IRA volunteers "calmly, clinically and coldly" walked down this street, planted two bombs. knowing innocent men, women and children out shopping would be the victims. Soon after the second bomb exploded Johnathan died and five days later my son died in my arms.

The men who murdered these innocent





victims were never caught and never will be, but quite possibly they may be listening today and may realise the futility of their actions here in Warrington. It did not further their cause but it did further the cause of peace. What began as an act of terrorism led to a sea-change in attitudes on both sides of the divide.

Had things been different, Tim and Johnathan might well have walked where we are now, hand in hand with their own children, but instead let's hope they are looking down saying 'well done' Warrington".



Sir John Major, the Prime Minister at the time of the bombing, sent his apologies for being unable to attend the service.

His message said: "I well remember receiving news of the bombing, made especially poignant by the injuries suffered by two such young children which also in both cases proved fatal. My thoughts will be with all those whose lives were torn apart that day."

#### *'Moving* On' - Young People's Radio Event



On Monday 18th March, Liverpool's Radio City came to the Peace Centre to record a radio programme called 'Moving On' which was broadcast on the 20th March.

In this recording of 'Late Night City', Pete Price hosted a gathering of young people from England and Northern Ireland who joined an expert panel to consider how or if the world has moved on since the Warrington bombing.

This event enabled young people to discuss whether we live in a far more progressive and peaceful society, have we learnt the lessons of the past or are





we still making the same mistakes?

# The Foundation receives global approval for their work in helping victims of terrorism

Colin and Wendy Parry received an invitation from the United States Government (State Department – Centre for Strategic Counterterrorism Communications) to attend a global Conference in United Arab Emirates.

The Conference, attended by 30 member countries, took place in Abu Dhabi in February. The couple were asked to talk about the work of the Foundation and discuss whether their programme for victims could be incorporated into the United Nations global counterterrorism strategy.

In 2002, the Foundation launched the 'Legacy Project' programme to support victims of the Northern Ireland 'Troubles' who were living in Great Britain. This unique programme has developed into 'Survivors for Peace', a programme which provides support to victims and others affected by any act of terrorism or violent extremism.



Colin added: "Survivors for Peace is unique because it enables victims to participate in carefully researched programmes where they can share their experiences with others and bring about positive change in their lives.

"The fact that our work is now being

viewed from Capitol Hill in Washington DC and diplomats and government officials have invited Wendy and me to present our work is a great honour and we hope that the work we started in Warrington will be adopted by the wider international community."

#### From the new Chief Executive

I joined the Foundation at the end of 2012 as Chief Executive, and over past 4 months, during the 20th anniversary commemorations, I have been extremely busy but enjoyed every minute.

Conflict has changed dramatically since 1993 and the Foundation has changed with it and is now a global leader in conflict prevention, resolution and response services.


We do three things. Deliver programmes which support victims of political violence, challenge extremism and radicalisation in communities and help people to develop the skills to promote good relations without resorting to violence, and provide training for professionals who are often tasked to deal with critical incidents.

We work nationally and internationally to prevent violence with those vulnerable to it, those affected by it, and those professionals who work to deal with it. By doing this we hope to reduce the possibility that people will need to use violence in order to further their aims.

We are independent, we are not politically aligned, we are not faith based, we work with all parties, we do not pursue causes and we receive all our money through your kind donations or from other charitable funding - that makes us truly unique and effective.

Thousands of people have benefited from our programmes and we have an incredible track record and so our strategy going forward is to do more of what we are good at.

Global conflict and the underlying risk factors that cause conflict are growing. Whilst Governments can try to counter terrorism and times have changed since 1993; there are still people everyday that will use violence to further their cause and our work is to try and prevent, resolve or respond to such circumstances. Our work is more important today than it has ever been.



#### Working with those affected by conflict

The Foundation's Survivors for Peace Programme works with people and family members who have been affected by violent conflict and acts of terrorism, whether they lost a loved one, were injured, or witnessed incidents.

The programme participants, primarily adults, come from across the UK. have different backgrounds and experiences and come together at the Peace Centre because of their experiences of conflict. They may have lost loved ones, served in conflicts, survived bombings or shootings in the UK e.g. the Northern Ireland 'Troubles', the bombings in London or abroad Sharm-el-Sheik, 9/11, Iraq and The Foundation offers Afghanistan. opportunities for people to come together in groups to discuss their experiences, learn from each other, learn about conflicts and develop their skills to do something positive with their experiences. Participants attend on a voluntary basis but only when they are ready to explore the issues above.

Many people we work with are former members of the Armed Forces, military families and those who lost loved ones in various campaigns around the world. We have started to work with people affected by the Warrington bombing, who have come forward as a result of the 20th Anniversary commemorations. The programmes on offer include 'Sharing Experiences', which gives people a chance to meet with others who've been through similar experiences; 'Conflict Resolution & Peacebuilding' which helps people to learn about different conflicts and 'Leadership Development' which gives people a chance to do something positive with their experience. The programme has helped over 350 survivors of conflict and terrorism living in England, Scotland and Wales and continues to grow. If you or anyone else



has been affected in this way, please feel free to get in contact if you are interested in participating.

A new participant at the Foundation is Mike McCue. Mike has a military background, having been posted to Aden during the early 1960's. Whilst posted in the Middle East he experienced distressing incidents that had a profound effect on him for many years, some of which he is only just beginning to confront. On leaving the Army he joined the Fire Service and completed over 26 years service. As you would expect, this profession also exposed Mike to a considerable number of traumatic situations. Much of what he saw during these two periods of his life contributed to him finally being diagnosed with PTSD. To date, he has attended two events and this is some of the feedback that Mike gave:

"What a fantastic day I had at the Peace Centre. I was overcome by the enthusiasm and keenness of all who attended. What I saw and heard from the other participants really began to open my mind and make me think about how I live my life and what I believe. I came to realise that many people have led a far worse life than I can ever imagine. The event helped me to begin seeing what I have in my life and the things that I should appreciate especially my wife, family and friends. I feel that there is so much on offer at the Centre and I'm particularly interested in the Sharing Experiences."

A few weeks later Mike did attend a Sharing Experiences weekend and here is some of his feedback:

"Thank you for a very enlightening weekend. I met and mixed with a fantastic group of people who came to share their experiences. It is hard to imagine people from "different sides" sitting together, talking and mixing; any differences set aside to listen to each other. What a wonderful sight it was to see us all drinking and breaking bread together, laughing and talking. What did I get from the weekend? I learned humility and how to listen to others. I heard the most amazing shares and at times could hardly believe what I was hearing. I was pleased to have shared my story too. The weekend demonstrated to me that if others can get on with their lives, after all that they have been through, then there is hope for me to get on with my life and they set me a good example to follow."

Mike has seen the value of attending events at the Peace Centre and will be a participant on some of the forthcoming events during the coming year.



#### Lisburn — Leadership for Peace Programme

This programme is sponsored by the: **Department for Foreign Affairs – Ireland.** 

The New Year started with an OCN accredited Leadership for Peace Programme for a group of young adults from Lisburn, Northern Ireland. The group comprised eighteen youth and community workers, sports coaches, community activists, aged 18-24 and all with a keen interest in developing their skills and knowledge further. The Foundation's Programme Manager Kelly Simcock delivered a Civic Lecture in May 2011 to the city's political leaders. A subsequent conversation about the Foundation's work led to a programme being designed to work with some of the future leaders from the area.

Focussed on the three key themes of conflict resolution, prejudice and discrimination and leadership - the programme consisted of two 4 day residentials with the group meeting in early January and mid-March. The mixed group included participants from catholic and protestant communities as well as young adults from Eastern Europe. Issues of identity, prejudice and discrimination were debated and discussed throughout the programmes with focus on issues which included the recent 'Flag protest', as well as the more contemporary challenges facing some communities in Northern Ireland around racism and xenophobia. The programme included lectures from guest speakers and a trip to Leeds to visit a school and community where the Foundation has been active in the past. The opportunity to meet with other leaders to exchange



was valuable for participants as they reflected on how these could be taken back to their own situations.

Senior youth worker Francie Ferris accompanied a group of participants from the Old Warren estate:

'The young people have gained confidence through the leadership

'The programme for me made a big impact in my life as it opened my eyes to the bigger picture..... I learnt a great deal on the programme and will use it in my work as a youth leader'.

skills they acquired and have become champions for peace within their local community. They have plans to develop the relationships and partnership working with the different groups involved in the Leadership for Peace Programme and would like to see programmes like the Leadership for Peace Programme delivered in the new Peace Centre being developed at the Maze Prison Site in Lisburn'.

Following the programme, three of the participants returned to the Peace Centre to take part in 'Moving On', a Radio show held during the week of the Foundation's 20th anniversary events.





#### The defence of marital coercion

#### by Jonathan Conder

The recent prosecution of former Cabinet minister Chris Huhne and his wife Vicky Pryce for perverting the course of justice received extensive coverage in the media and many opinions have been aired regarding the justice of the prison sentences they received.

One of the many notable aspects of the case was Vicky Pryce's reliance on the rare defence of marital coercion which was introduced by section 47 of the Criminal Justice Act 1925. This defence is highly unusual in that it is available only to married women. It can only be relied upon where an offence (other than murder or treason) is committed in the presence of and under the coercion of the defendant's husband. The same section of the 1925 Act abolished a legal presumption, quite extraordinary to modern observers, that an offence committed

by a married woman in her husband's presence will have been committed under his coercion.

What does coercion mean in the context of the section 47 defence? In effect a wife must show that pressure was exerted by her husband to such an extent that her will was overborne, in other words she was impelled to commit the offence because she believed she had no choice. Unlike the similar defence of duress it is not necessary for any threat of serious violence or death to have been made. However it is not enough to show that the wife was persuaded to commit the offence, however reluctantly, by force of argument or through a misplaced sense of loyalty or love or in order to avoid inconvenience. There must be an element of compulsion in that the dominating influence of the husband must overcome the unwillingness of

the wife. As the trial judge in the Vicky Pryce case remarked, the legal concept of marital coercion has its roots in a time when a wife was her husband's chattel and he was entitled to chastise her physically. Although the reform introduced by section 47 may have seemed progressive in the mid 1920s the continuing existence of this defence seems anachronistic to many in the 21st century. The Law Commission recommended its abolition some years before the Vicky Pryce case and it is likely to come under further scrutiny given the considerable attention it has received recently.



#### Getting used to the changes

We are getting used to the government delegating the job of making new laws to unelected bodies. The latest example of this is an increase of more than 45% in the rate of tax payable by some taxpayers which is being imposed by HM Revenue & Customs. This increase was not mentioned in ints increase was not mentioned in the budget, nor has it been debated in Parliament. It has simply been imposed by decree by the tax office.

On 4 April HMRC announced that as from 6 April 2013 all partners, as from 5 April 2013 all partners, as from 5 April 2013 all partners.

including sleeping and inactive limited partners, will be required to pay Class 2 and Class 4 NIC. Previously, sleeping partners and inactive limited partners, meaning partners who take no active part in running the business but, perhaps, have provided some finance, were not required to pay

This provision is admittedly of fairly limited application, and will not affect a large number of people. However, those who are affected will see their tax rates increase from 20%, assuming a basic rate taxpayer, to 29%. Additionally, they will have to pay Class 2 NIC, currently £2.70 per

week. They will also have to register as self employed, presumably by 31st July 2013, or face an automatic penalty of £100.

This increase results from a "change

This increase results from a "change of view" by the tax office, which can surely only mean that their previous view was mistaken. HMRC have stated that they will not be attempting to backdate this "change of view", or to charge penalties on taxpayers who complied with this previous view. We can only be grateful for their generosity in that, for once, the tax office is not trying to blame everyone else for their mistakes. However, we note that they are not accepting any responsibility themselves.

We do not necessarily disagree


