

# Mersey Gateway and Silver Jubilee Bridge statistics

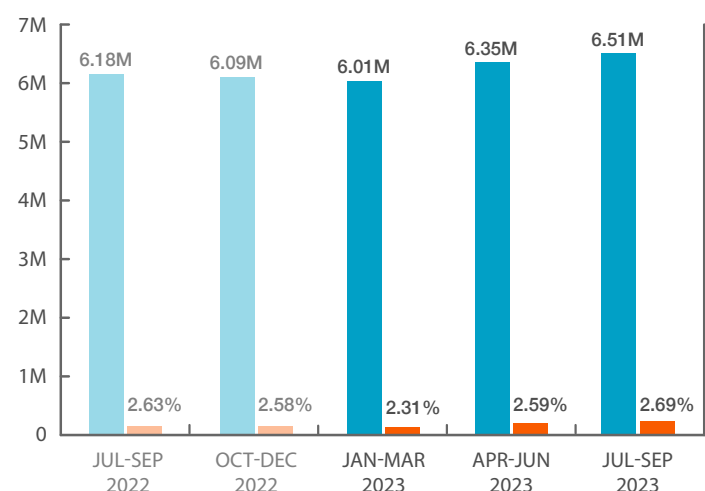
## DURING JULY TO SEPTEMBER 2023:

- **CROSSINGS OVER THE RIVER MERSEY IN HALTON CONTINUE TO BREAK RECORDS** – 6.51 million journeys were made over the Mersey Gateway and Silver Jubilee bridges between July - September 2023, the highest quarterly figure since the Mersey Gateway Bridge opened
- **TRAFFIC LEVELS ON THE SILVER JUBILEE BRIDGE BACK TO NORMAL** – 340,000 journeys were made in September 2023 on the fully reopened Silver Jubilee Bridge, the joint highest since it was changed to one lane in each direction
- **79,000 VEHICLES NOW CROSS THE RIVER IN HALTON EVERY WEEK DAY** – with 85% of them using the Mersey Gateway Bridge
- **OVER 97% OF JOURNEYS WERE PAID FOR ON TIME** – the vast majority of people are paying for their journeys by midnight the day after they cross as we approach the sixth anniversary of the opening of the Mersey Gateway Bridge

All revenue, either from tolls/charges or PCNs, contributes towards payment for the Mersey Gateway Bridge. It is not retained by the council or any of its contractors.

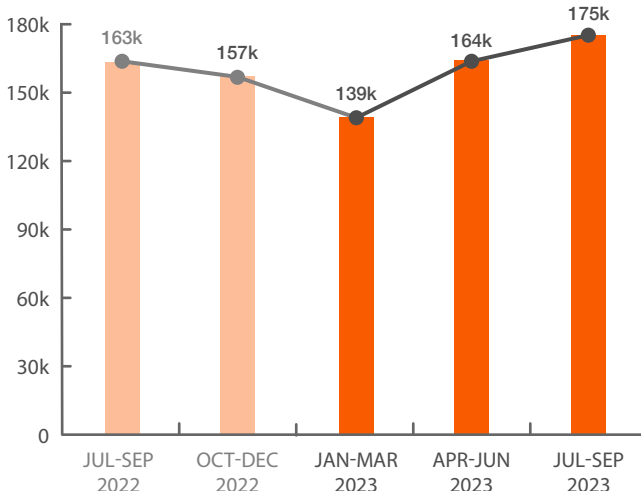
### Record number of bridge crossings made

Total journeys and number of PCNs issued

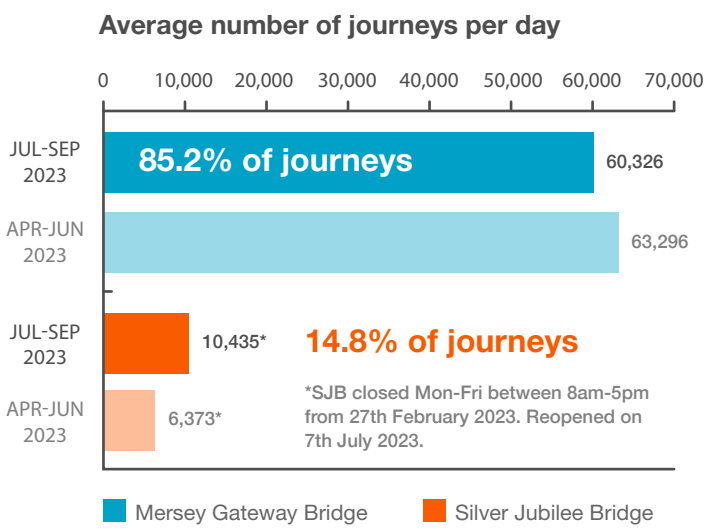


### PCNs rise alongside journey levels

PCNs issued

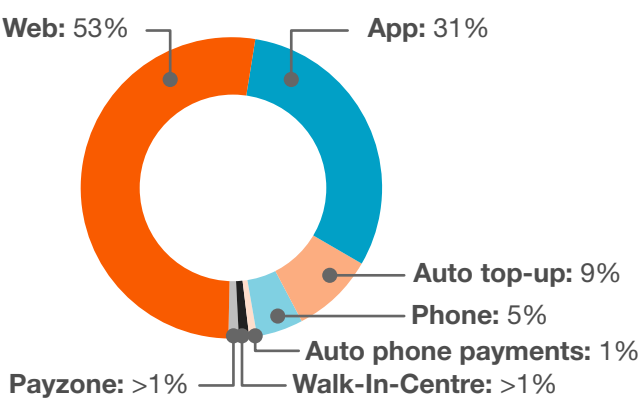


## Bridge usage from July – September 2023

### Over 94% of payments made via digital or automated channels

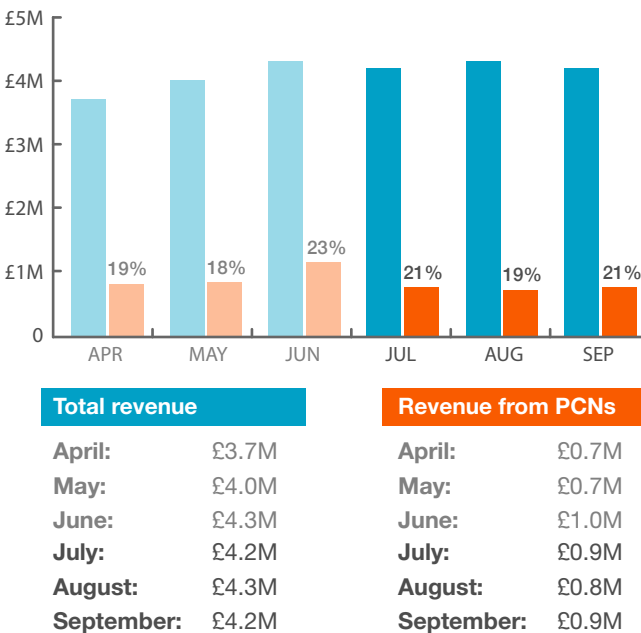


## Total journeys and Penalty Charge Notices (PCNs)
