working part-time approaching his 87th birthday! As well as hard working he is also the most modest man I have ever met and will be wondering why he has been honoured for doing his job. I had to conceal the honour from him until the last minute and told him he was coming to the Parr Hall to see me collect an award.

He was completely shellshocked by the honour - but one in my opinion richly deserved, after dedicating a huge part of his life to providing free community news for all in a balanced and independent



way.

He has almost 70 years of He has almost 70 years of local news reporting experience across Warrington. He started his career with the Knutsford Guardian, Warrington Guardian and Lancashire Evening Post, before setting up his own local media organisation, Orbit News, more than 50 years ago, while living in Croft, which is now a third generation family business.

Since launching our Warrington-

Since launching our Warrington-based titles, he has covered hundreds – if not thousands – of community features and stories. His journalism has supported many community and voluntary organisations to receive profile across Warrington.

During the Covid-19 pandemic,

Warrington Worldwide established its Legacy Project, investing grants into local groups and charities.

What many people don't know is that both of us were nearly not here to tell the tale, when almost 30 years ago he suffered a cricketing injury playing at Glazebury Cricket Club that almost cost him his life, while I almost died after a hospital operation went wrong - both within six months of each other.

So if you ever wonder why I believe in fate - you now know why.

Congratulations Dad- we lived to tell the tale and none of it would have been possible without the support of mum!

# Croft pupils meet rail consultancy experts

PUPILS at Croft Primary School welcomed professionals from independent rail consultancy SLC Rail for an inspiring visit.

Thomas Coon, regional lead for the North and Emma Massey, project manager, captivated the youngsters with presentations on the world of civil engineering relating the examples to local infrastructure projects.

Addressing 90 children from years 2, 4 and 5 over two interactive

sessions, Emma and Thomas shared their expertise and passion for rail projects, particularly those transforming the North of England, including the development of the nearby Golborne station.

Thomas Coon said: "Croft Primary School is situated in an area which has significant opportunities for rail development, including the proposed Northern Powerhouse Rail route between Liverpool and Manchester Piccadilly."

"Improved connectivity in Warrington will be a game-changer for this generation, creating new job opportunities and fostering economic growth. Engaging with young people early on is crucial to spark their interest in civil engineering and show them the diverse opportunities and career paths available in the rail industry."

The older students from years 4 and 5 also had a unique opportunity channel their creativity by their own railway Their designs conveyed designing an instinct for understanding what a rail passenger needs, such as ensuring there were retail outlets and spaces for EV scooters.

Emma Massey said: "We thoroughly enjoyed our time with the children, helping them realise

that their hobbies can translate into exciting careers in civil engineering. Whether it's ecology for animal lovers or engineering for Minecraft enthusiasts, there's a discipline for everyone in this field."

# Plans to convert a five-bedroom house into children's care home are opposed

PLANS to convert a five-bedroom family home into a children's care home in an isolated rural area are being opposed by local residents.

Police have also said they could not support the application by Care 4 Every Children at The Oaks, in Holly Bush Lane, Rixton-with-Glazebrook.

Most of the objections relate to the possibility of increased traffic on a narrow, unadopted lane where there are no pavements or street lighting.

But objectors also point out that Holly Bush Lane is off the busy A57 close to an accident "hot spot".

The application is to change the use of a large house standing in its own grounds into a care home for up to four children.

There would also be three care staff and a manager on-site, with

two care staff on duty overnight.

The applicants say there is parking for around 10 cars in a spacious gravel courtyard area and the property has it own entrance through private gates leading to secluded private grounds.

Children living at the property would be unable to live at home due to unfortunate circumstances such as abuse and neglect. The care provided would be "as close to a family environment as possible."

The children would cook meals with the adult, go on activities of an evening, such as cinema trips, restaurants, days out, etc, and have the childhood they deserved.

They would be encouraged to help around the house with chores, making meals and gardening, etc. They would be in the 8-18 age range.

There would be no material change made to the property which

would retain its current layout and use as a family home. There would be no increase in traffic and staff would be recruited locally.

The proposals are currently being considered by Warrington Borough Council planners.



### Community pub asks local people what they want

GLAZEBURY'S community pub, The Raven, is continuing to consult with local people to make sure it provides what they want.

"That allowed the chefs to adjust and tweak the menu according to the specific feedback. It has been a lot of work but very much worth it

"Last month we introduced our volunteer's initiative. This is really taking off, helping the Raven to maintain its high standards, whilst allowing those who are able, to become even more involved in the Raven."
