IT was an extremely proud moment for our family when my father David was made Honorary Freeman of Warrington.

When I entered the family when I entered the ramily business as a 15-year-old learning the trade in my school holidays, before joining full-time at 16, he set high standards for me to follow - with a work ethic like no other - and is still working part-time approaching his 87th hirthdayl

approaching his 87th birthday!

As well as hard working he is also the most modest man I have ever met and will be wondering why he has been honoured for doing his job. I had to conceal the honour from him until the last minute and told him he was coming to the Parr Hall to see me collect an award

He was completely shellshocked by the honour - but one in my opinion richly deserved, after dedicating a huge part of his life to providing free community news for all in a balanced and independent

He has almost 70 years of local news reporting experience across Warrington. He started his career with the Knutsford Guardian, Warrington Guardian and Warrington Lancashire Evening Post, before setting up his own local media organisation, Orbit News, more than 50 years ago, which is now

a third-generation family business. Since launching our Warringtonbased titles, he has covered hundreds – if not thousands – of community features and stories. His journalism has supported many community and voluntary organisations to receive profile across Warrington.

During the Covid-19 pandemic, Warrington Worldwide also established its Legacy Project, investing grants into local groups and charities.

What many people don't know is that both of us were nearly not here to tell the tale, when almost 30 years ago he suffered a cricketing injury that almost cost him his life,



while I almost died after a hospital operation went wrong - both within six months of each other.
So if you ever wonder why I believe in fate - you now know why.

Congratulations Dad- we lived to tell the tale and none of it would have been possible without the support of my mum!

Work starts on new Digital Hub



WORK has commenced on the £5m refurbishment of St James Business Centre with a new Warrington Digital Hub.

The investment will see the creation of a new entrance on Wilderspool Causeway and a raft of improvements, including new co-working space, a coffee shop,

meeting rooms and enhanced facilities for tenants. A refurbished atrium and a new glazed lift are also included, alongside improved outdoor space for access to the

coffee shop. Work is expected to be concluded in twelve months'

The thriving business centre, currently home to more than 40 companies, will be re-branded as Warrington Digital Hub as part of Wire Regeneration's remit to ensure that the town's economy remains competitive and forwardlooking in the joint venture between Warrington Borough Council and

Langtree,
"St James Business Centre has
always been a home for ambitious
SMEs and our investment aims

always been a home for ambitious SMEs and our investment aims to reinforce that, whilst attracting the latest generation of tech-led start-ups to Warrington," said Steve Park, Director of Growth at Warrington Borough Council.

Jayne Furnival, group property director at Langtree, said: "Our vision is to create an environment where new technologies and ideas can be tested and refined. We'll be delivering contemporary and creative facilities that will support networking and collaboration, key ingredients in driving innovation."

Wire Regeneration is working

closely with the parish authorities at neighbouring St James's Church to ensure that the new building and surrounding landscaping sit well alongside one another.

"The development is part of wider ambitions for Warrington's wider ambitions for Warrington's Southern Gateway, of which St James's Church is a prominent landmark, and we're pleased with the dialogue that we have established with the parish," said Jayne. "We have also informed our wider neighbours about the work, including providing them with a weekly update on forthcoming works via the project web site." The first phase of the new facility was opened in November last year with the launch of a new Digital Suite for the University of Chester. The suite operates technology from the renowned Hydra Foundation to train blue light personnel in the management of critical incidents.

The group is charged with crafting a strategy for the £17bn rail link between the two cities that maximises potential benefits to the region, while also linking the Liverpool City Region and Greater Manchester investment zones. 

Divorce Column

Cohabitation Breakdown

Times have changed. People and families evolve and an increasing number of couples move in together and start a family without getting married, and whilst some might give some thought to what would happen with respect to their home and other assets in the event the relationship breaks down, I know from experience and from some of the common questions we are asked in cohabitation breakdown scenarios that many people do not, or perhaps they have given it some thought but they have mistakenly thought the legal position is different from how it really is.

The key thing to understand is that the law in relation to cohabitation breakdown is not the same as for marriage or civil partnership breakdown. There is a common misconception that unmarried couples who live together are 'common law' partners and have the same rights as married couples or civil partnership partners, but the fact is that they don't. It's not true; it is a myth! There is no such thing as 'common law' marriage and so it follows there is no such thing as common law husband and wife or common law partners

Unmarried couples who live together are quite simply an unmarried couple living together and it comes as a surprise to some to discover on the breakdown of the relationship that they have no automatic right or entitlement to make financial claims against the other and that this is the case irrespective of how long they have lived together. That is, no right to any form of financial support for themselves (child support being a separate issue) and no right to a share of the other's pension. As regards the family home this on the face of it depends on how the property is owned but it can get complicated and in some cases the dispute can involve complex contractual, trust and land law principles. Each case turns on its own facts and sometimes the smallest of details can have a significant bearing on the eventual outcome.

Success for Culture Warrington's second music festival of the year

FOLLOWING the Winter Music Festival at Parr Hall in January, 'Culture Warrington' have done it again with their Summer version held in the town centre on May 25, only this time it was bigger and better than last year!

Let's be honest, we were extremely lucky with the weather and the Saturday dawned with a very promising high of 21 degrees which is ideal for music festival goers, music lovers and families alike and many turned out for a superb day of well organised entertainment. With the main stage in Golden Square and a second located in Time Square there was plenty of music on offer, ranging from Ukulele bands, Blues, Acoustic acts, Keyboard acts, Rock and Indie and something to suit everybody. Sadly and unlike the Marvel Character ' Mister Fantastic ' I couldn't stretch to being in two places at once so like a 'Glastonbury stage trotter' I noted who I hadn't seen before (or reported on in Warrington Worldwide previously) and flitted between the two stages as best as I could.

It proved to be the best strategy and I witnessed some excellent performances from the early 12pm slot on the Golden Square music festival stage, namely 'Barstaff' from Wigan who I hadn't seen before and the Summery, funky sound of 'Isla Rico' who proved very popular in the sunshine. Some of the bands like young up and comers 'Freight' had agreed to do an early 1.30pm slot at Golden Square and a later 6.45pm slot at Time Square with their teenage fan club and merchandise table in tow throughout. What a great idea, and this enhanced two exciting performances from the lads who have an average age of just 17!

The Time Square music festival stage opened at 1pm and when it was time to move down there midafternoon it meant I had to miss some main stage acts although my fellow writers and photographers informed me that 'The Odeens' in particular played a strong set and have come on enormously since I first saw them live as a Youth Zone start up back in August 2023, and with their own band of EMO Rock teenage followers I was delighted to hear it .On arrival at Time Square I found it basked in sunlight and plenty of people were clearly enjoying themselves. Surrounded

by so many bars and food outlets there were lots of families being entertained by the quieter electro-acoustic sets and I was reliably informed by a fellow musician that The Ukulele Uff Trio with a guest appearance by renowned and local Blues musician Pete Price gave a well received performance.

Unfortunately, it wasn't long before I was feeling the effects of the sun and without a hat I headed for cover into the welcome shade of The Hop Emporium and a quick Pacifico before taking stock and catching up with a few other revellers. I also noticed that The Pink Leaf Cocktail bar had set up their mobile trailer with a fenced enclosure and deck chairs, a bit of well planned optimism which looked brilliant!. However, back to the music and in this game one ear is always open to the stage and the sound of electro-acoustic guitar performer Matty Hignet drifted in on a very pleasant breeze. Matty's set was mixed and very good indeed, his playing and vocals were solid but as always on this stage with many families present, covers were going to be more popular and it wasn't long before people were joining in with his excellent renditions of Teenage Dirthag' by Wheatus and 'Smells like Teen Spirit' by Nirvana, cannily captured on video by editor Gary in our earlier Warrington Worldwide report. So, hat's off to all the solo performers of the day, it's certainly not easy following a band and can be quite unnerving as the audience goes quiet for a time as you tune up and start.

Indeed, up next at the music festival and following a very short changeover (kudos to the sound team), keyboard player Joseph O'Brien took to the stage. Now I'm going, to be honest here readers and say it's not usually 'my thing', but that's the beauty of music, someone will always change your mind and in this instance it was Joseph. As a guitarist at least you can move and jump about, but as a keyboard player you are sat in the same position and if you are singing as well there is nowhere





Missing NI years update

Last year HMRC stated taxpayers will now have an extra two years to make additional payments to their National Insurance (NI) contributions to increase state pension entitlements.

The cut-off point for voluntary NI contributions from April 2006 to April 2017 has been extended to 5 April 2025 to help people to plug gaps in their NI record - an extension of nearly two years.

HMRC has now also released an

online tool to enable taxpayers to pay the missing years online which follows a number of reported problems over the past 18 months as people struggled getting through to either the DWP or HMRC on the telephone helplines.

HMRC's original plan had set the deadline to 5 April 2023, however in March 2023 this was extended to 31 July, following capacity problems on government helplines. Extending the deadline until 2025 means that taxpayers will have more time to properly consider whether paying voluntary contributions, which could boost their state pension entitlement, is right for them.

All relevant National Insurance contributions payments will be accepted at the rates applicable from 2022 to 2023 until 5 April 2025

Pensions (DWP) hopes the extension will grant staff more time to cope with the high level of interest - as thousands of people are expected to take advantage.

Capital gains tax when selling your home

Most people selling their homes rely on Private Residence Relief (PRR) to avoid capital gains tax (CGT) but with increases to this on the horizon some may end up with higher tax bills when they move.

For the vast majority of individuals capital gain arising on the sale of their main home will be exempt from CGT due to PRR, also commonly referred to as Principal Private Residence Relief (PPR).

Whilst large numbers of individuals rely on this relief when selling their home, it is far from well understood. This is despite it being one of the most valuable tax reliefs in the UK, with the latest statistics estimating that it cost the Treasury around £31.5bn in the 2023/24 tax year. The lack of understanding is largely due to the rules being difficult to follow, but in broad terms the relief will typically apply in full when:

- the property sold has been your only or main residence during the whole period of your ownership;
- you have not been absent from the property, other than for the last nine months of ownership and certain other specifically allowed absences;
- no part of the home has been used exclusively for business purposes; and
- the garden or grounds do not exceed half a hectare or are required for the reasonable enjoyment of the property as a home

There are various instances in which an individual can potentially end up with a taxable chargeable gain arising on the sale of their main home. For example, this might happen when two individuals each own a property and then move into one of them, to live together, or if lengthy renovation works were undertaken before an individual moved into a new home.

When a CGT liability arises on the sale of a residential property, it's usually necessary to separately report this on a CGT return and pay any associated tax within 60 days of completion. In data released to RSM UK following a freedom of information request, HMRC has confirmed that 51,800 CGT returns in the 2021/22 tax year included claims for PPR relief.

In the past, even those taxpayers who could not benefit from PPR in respect of a full gain could have potentially relied on the CGT annual exemption to cover an unexpected taxable chargeable gain. However, the CGT annual exemption was cut from £12,300 in the 2022/23 tax year to £6,000 in the 2023/24 tax

year, and now stands at £3,000.

There is now limited room for error and the safety net of the CGT annual exemption has been largely pulled away. We could therefore see the number of disposals of homes on which CGT is due increase substantially. At the moment, such tax is due at a rate of either 18% or 24% depending on whether the seller is a basic or higher rate taxpayer respectively.

With reports of lobbying for CGT rates to be increased, and such proposals now being included in the manifesto pledges of some political parties, some homeowners could find themselves with a surprisingly high tax bill when they come to move home. For others it could be even worse if they don't realise they have a bill to pay, and end up incurring HMRC penalties and interest as well

Wembley heartbreak for Warrington Wolves



WARRINGTON Wolves suffered Wembley heartbreak again to Wigan Warriors as they lost out 18-8.

In the first meeting between the two clubs at Wembley since the 1990 final, the Wolves went down fighting with a spirited second-half fightback.

But the Warriors proved too strong after dominating the first-half. Beyan French led from the front as Wigan recovered from a riotous opening period to wrap up a recordextending 21st Challenge Cup title. The reigning Super League Man of Steel set up Zach Eckersley for

Wigan's opening try and stretched over for the second himself to ensure his side also became the first team since 2007 to hold all four of the game's major honours at once.

Warrington rallied and Matt

Dufty's late try gave them a glimmer of hope but in truth they were second or nope but in frum they were second best throughout and seldom looked likely to deliver the prestigious silverware to head coach Sam Burgess in his first season in charge. Tributes to Leeds great Rob Burrow completed the build-up to the final with the 64,845 crowd at Wombley. The biggest since 2017

Wembley - the biggest since 2017 rising for an impeccably-observed minute's silence prior to kick-off, and again seven minutes into the match in honour of the shirt he wore with such aplomb.

But the two sides were guilty of taking Burrow's famous fighting spirit a little too literally in a wild start that saw both Wigan's Mike Cooper and Warrington full-back Dufty sent to the sin bin for separate incidents.

Cooper, preferred for only his third start of the season in the Wigan front row, was penalised by referee Chris Kendall for a swinging arm that left Warrington winger Josh Thewlis prostrate on the turf.
But two minutes later Warrington's

numerical advantage was wiped out when Dufty also exited for a high tackle on Liam Marshall that sparked a mass confrontation on the touchline.

Warrington showed early signs of emerging best equipped after the early chaos, with captain George Williams stopped yards from the line before a Wigan offside gave Thewlis the chance to kick his side in front.

But the high-octane start was clearly having an impact, with Burgess' side guilty of being overeager as they gradually gifted their opponents the initiative, culminating in Wigan's opening try in the 19th

After nudging deep into their ponents' territory, French opponents' territory, delivered a perfectly-timed grubber into the path of Eckersley, who seized his moment on only his fourth appearance for the club, shrugging off Matty Ashton to touch down.

Ashton's knock-on three minutes later from Harry Smith's high ball kept Warrington pinned back and led to Wigan's second try, Abbas Miski and Jai Field stretching the Wire defence before French touched down following a scrum.

Warrington looked ragged and unfocused, the normally outstanding Williams off the pace, and they were fortunate to reach half-time within touching distance after French stretched an arm over only to be penalised for a marginal double movement

Ten points adrift, Burgess' side desperately needed to start the second half on the front foot and they came close five minutes after the restart when Ashton grasped a looping pass wide from Williams only to be bundled into touch within sight of the line.

At the other end, Rodrick Tai's superb intervention denied Marshall a certain try, and there were signs, particularly through the increasingly influential Williams, that Warrington

were stirring.
Enter Warriors veteran Liam Farrell, who marked his fifth final by streaking onto a short pass from Field, stepping inside Josh Drinkwater then rolling through a last-ditch challenge from Matty Nicholson to put further clear air

between the two sides. Smith's third conversion gave Matt Peet's men an 18-2 advantage but Warrington responded well and gave themselves a glimmer of hope with 15 minutes remaining when Dufty arrowed in from the left, Thewlis' conversion reducing the arrears to 10.

But Wigan saw out the final moments with the minimum of fuss to take the trophy for the second time in three years and add it to the Grand Final, League Leaders' Shield and World Club Challenge trophies they already own.




