IT was an extremely proud moment for our family when my father David , who has been a resident of Lymm for more than four decades was made Honorary Freeman of Warrington.

When I entered the family business as a 15-year-old schoolboy, learning the trade in my school holidays, before joining fulltime at 16, he set high standards for me to follow - with a work ethic like no other - and is still working part-time approaching his 87th birthday!

As well as hard working he is also the most modest man I have ever met and will be wondering why he has been honoured for doing his job. I had to conceal the honour from him until the last minute and told him he was coming to the Parr Hall to see me collect an award.

He was completely shellshocked by the honour - but one in my opinion richly deserved, after dedicating a huge part of his life to providing free community news for all in a balanced and independent



way. He has almost 70 years of local news reporting experience across Warrington. He started his career with the Knutsford Guardian, Warrington Guardian and Lancashire Evening Post, before setting up his own local media organisation, Orbit News, more than 50 years ago which is now a third-generation family business.

Since launching Lýmm Life and our other Warrington-based titles, he has covered hundreds – if not thousands – of community features and stories. His journalism has supported many community and voluntary organisations to receive profile across Warrington.

exploded outside his home. The piano, which was ironically made in Germany, shielded him from the blast.

The same piano has since been gifted to Sir Thomas Botler High School to benefit young musicians. So, if you ever wonder why I believe in fate - you now know why.

Local media founder made Honorary Freeman

CO-founder of Lymm Life and Warrington Worldwide, David Skentelbery, has been made Honorary Freeman of Warrington at a special meeting of the borough council.

David, who has lived in Lymm for more than 40 years, has been recognised as a champion of providing free community news for all, across the current local titles of Warrington Worldwide, Lymm Life and Culcheth Life.

He has almost 70 years of local news reporting experience across Warrington and the North West. He started his career with the Knutsford Guardian before moving on to the Warrington Guardian and then the Lancashire Evening Post, before setting up his own local media organisation, Orbit News, more than 50 years ago.

Twenty five years ago, along with son Gary, he set up Warrington Worldwide, the borough-wide free magazine and news website, as

well as helping launch Lymm Life. Since arriving in Warrington in 1960 David has covered hundreds – if not thousands – of stories. His journalism has helped many community and voluntary organisations to receive profile across Warrington. During the Covid-19 pandemic, Warrington Worldwide also

Warrington Worldwide also established its Legacy Project, investing grants into local groups and charities – further proof David's community-centred of

approach to work. Mayor of Warrington, Cllr Steve Wright, said: "David has been an exceptional servant to Warrington

through decades of dedicated reporting. He has put countless community causes and groups on the map, helping to shine a light on many successes within the on many borough.

David's son and Warrington Worldwide co-founder, Gary Skentelbery, said: "It is an absolute honour to see my father receive this recognition. He is probably the most modest person I have ever met in my life and will be wondering why he has been given this award for 'doing his job'.

for 'doing his job'. "He has helped to change the face of the media, spending thousands of hours working in the council chambers over many years, ensuring local people knew what was happening in the corridors of power.

"His invaluable support, working behind the scenes, in the engine room, enabled me to get out and about in the community, ensuring the people of Warrington get a free, independent news source, seven days a week, 365 days of the year.

None of this would have been ossible without my father's possible dedication and commitment Warrington."

As a toddler David survived the blitz when a bomb exploded

outside the family home Manchester, with him surviving thanks to being asleep under a German mino-grand piano, which has since been donated to Sir Thomas Boteler High School.



LEJOG cycle ride raises over £7,000 for CAFT charity

Lymm still has a Tory MP

DESPITE the Labour landslide victory in the General Election, Lymm still has a Conservative MP. Boundary changes have "moved" the village from the Warrington South constituency into neighbouring Tatton, where sitting Conservative MP Esther McVey held onto the seat – albeit with a majority reduced from 18,357 to just 1,136. The full result for Tatton was: Nigel Hennerly, Green Party 2,571 Ryan Jude, Labour Party 18,820 Esther McVey, Conservative and Unionist Party. 19,956 Jonathan Smith, Liberal Democrats 4,614 Oliver George Speakman, Reform UK. 5,948. On a visit to Lymm during the election campaign, Ms McVey pointed out that she lived only a few minutes drive from Lymm and knew the village well. She pledged to work with Warrington Borough Council but said she was ready to "hold them to account" if and when necessary. Prior to the election she was Minister without Portfolio in the Cabinet Office, describing herself as "The Minister for Common Sense."

Crowds flock to Lymm Historic Transport Dc

An estimated 10,000 people visited Lymm village for the annual Historic Transport Day, which helps raise funds for local good causes.

Cars, Boats, Model Railways, Traction Engines, Lego, bicycles, motor-bikes, great food from round the world plus heaps of entertainments and activities for the whole family were on show, including the 'oldest' form of transport a Roman Quadriga! (pictured right).

(pictured right). Various organisations also had displays throughout the village and on the May Queen Field including Lymm Photographic Society" who had a brilliant display from local photographers showing the historic village.

Since 2013 Lymm Historic Transport Day has been one of the village's major events and a crucial source of funding for many worthy local causes. Originally put together each year by Alan Williams and a dedicated group of volunteers, it is now led by local resident Jack Levy, who first encountered the event when he was house hunting in the village in 2018 and made him realise Lymm was "a place like no other."

He stepped up to takeover fronting the event following the retirement of event creator Alan.

With an estimated 10,000 people flocking to the village for the Historic Transport Day, which included a flotilla of barges on the Bridgewater Canal, local good causes are set to benefit from funds raised.

Refurbishment work underway on Pepper Street

The road is originally Roman, so has probably seen a few repairs over the years. It's great to see sets retained – Pepper Street is a corruption of Pebble Street, and reflects the original cobbles used to surface it."

Almost 250 people took part in a consultation in autumn 2022, aimed at getting local views on the best returbishment options for the stone setts. The majority of respondents said they would like to see the road reconstructed with reclaimed setts.

Having sourced the reclaimed setts – of the right type and size – the council is now moving ahead with the works, with timescales as follows:

There will be nighttime road closures from 7pm to 1 am, Monday to Friday (Saturday morning) to allow workers to reconstruct the road, lay channels and lay a temporary asphalt running surface. This will take 4 to 5 weeks to complete.

During this time, access will be permitted outside of the closure times for residents, businesses and schools.

From the start of the school holidays:

 Pepper Street will be closed 24-hours-a-day, 7-days-a-week for the removal of the temporary running surface and laying of the stone setts.

• The road will remain closed to through traffic until all the setts have been laid.

It is estimated that the works will take up to 20 weeks to complete.

Please note – when Pepper Street is closed, the access at Longbutt Lane onto Scholars Green Lane will always be open for vehicular traffic to get in and out of the grea

always be open for vehicular traffic to get in and out of the area. Warrington Borough Council's Director of transport and environment, David Boyer, said: "This is an important project within Lymm's conservation area, which will deliver much needed refurbishment and provide a high quality surface for many years to come.

"We apologise for the short-term disruption and thank everyone for their patience while this work is carried out."

Divorce and the family home

Divorce is a challenging and emotional process and one of the most contentious and emotive issues that often arises is the division of the family home. The family home is not just a significant financial asset but also holds sentimental value, making the issue of its division a complex matter and often a sticking point when trying to come to an agreement.

Although in principle it doesn't matter whether the property is owned in joint names or in one party's sole name, it is important to understand the ownership structure so as to be able to make informed decisions during the divorce process. Depending on the type of ownership there may be steps which a party needs to consider so as to protect their interests regarding the property before a settlement is reached.

There isn't an endless list of possibilities as to what can happen with the family home on divorce and typically the options are: (a) **Sale:** the property be sold immediately and the net proceeds divided in whatever proportions can be agreed, or where there is no agreement as decided by the court; (b) **Transfer:** the ownership of the property be transferred into the sole name of one of the parties so they can continue living there, perhaps with the children. Depending on the circumstances of the case the party retaining the home may need to make a payment of a lump sum of money to the other; (c) **Deferred sale:** there be a deferred sale so as to allow one party and the children to remain living in the home until a future specified date or event occurs and then the property be sold.

There are several legal matters for the court to have regard to when considering what order to make concerning the family home, but there are also some practical aspects for the parties to consider, such as for example, affordability – where one party is seeking to retain the property, and the availability of suitable rehousing – where either or both are seeking that the property be sold.
