Former bank transformation coincides with Memory Banks exhibition

WITH work well underway on the conversion of the former Barclays Bank building in Lymm village centre, a special Memory Banks exhibition is set to open.

Situated on the corner of Bridgewater Street the former Barclays Bank building, which had been vacant for years and fallen into disrepair, is being transformed into new retail units.

into new retail units.

While the bank may have provided an important service in its day, the building itself was deeply unpopular with many local people who felt it was inappropriate in its setting and something of an eyesore, says Alan Williams, from Lymm Heritage centre, which has launched a "Memory bank" exhibition. It had become even worse since the bank closed and had become an easy target for fly posters.



Alan says the general opinion of the conversion seems to be a big "thumbs up" with a design that harks back to earlier days and blends far more successfully with its surroundings. And while residents are looking forward to see who sets up businesses there, Lymm Heritage Centre is marking the occasion of the work's completion by telling the story of the site over the past two hundred years, from the days when it was a wheelwrights workshop with the Lymm Poor House just across the road.

"Bridgewater Street is a microcosm of the development of the whole village and so many other similar places" said exhibition developer Alan. "Over the last two centuries the area has moved through phases of being occupied by tradesmen, then retailers and now services. Remarkably too, it was only forty years ago that local traders were banding together to fight the potential arrival of 'yet another bank'. Now, of course there are none".

The exhibition "Memory Banks" which opens on August 15th is at Lymm Heritage Centre, 1 Legh St WA13 ODA (open Thursday to Sunday 12-4). Admission is free.

Planners approve link extension to barn conversion



PLANNING chiefs at Warrington have given the go-ahead to proposals to link an existing barn conversion to an adjoining former agricultural property in Lymm.

The development is proposed at Cherry Lane Barns and will be accessed from Cherry Lane.

In recent years the former farm site has undergone conversion to form four individual dwellings. The barns involved had not been used for agricultural purposes for at least 1.5 years.

The newly approved scheme will result in one of the barns known as the Cowshed being linked to another unit known as The Hayloft by a single-storey extension. by a single-storey extension.

Warrington Borough Council

planning officers say the proposal is acceptable. The flat-roofed extension will not be visible from the public highway and while not particularly in keeping with the agricultural character of a barn, the site has already lost some of its agricultural character.

The proposal will be a modern addition to the site, but with the use of sympathetic materials will not have an unacceptable impact on the existing buildings, nor the street

Lymm High School's activity centre re-opens on Anglesey

Ty'n-y-Felin, Lymm High School's residential outward-bound centre on Anglesey, has reopened this term after a prolonged closure since the COVID pandemic.

The first students to stay at the centre were on a biology fieldtrip, and all Year 7 students had the "Tynny experience" during July.
Located near Rhoscolyn on the west side of Anglesey, Ty'n-y-Felin has been part of the Lymm High School offer to students since the 1950s. With a 60-bed residential accommodation. accommodation, classrooms and leisure facilities, it is close to fabulous beaches, with lots of opportunities for outdoor activities like coasteering, canoeing, hiking and sports.

Ty'n-y-Felin had to close in early 2020 due to COVID pandemic restrictions, and once the school was able to use it again, significant was able to use it again, significant external repairs and internal updating were needed. Gwyn Williams, headteacher at Lymm High School said: "It is great to see students enjoying Ty'n-y-Felin again – it is pretty unique for a state school to have a facility like." state school to have a facility like this and we are keen to make full use of it in the future.

To that end, Lymm High School is working in partnership with The

Challenge Academy Trust (TCAT) which runs a number of primary and secondary schools across Warrington including Priestley College, to broaden the use of Ty'ny-Felin to other groups of school students from the wider Warrington community. Doing so will help to ensure a sustainable future for Ty'ny-Felin, with better facilities and higher levels of occupancy.

As part of this collaboration Lymm High School will continue to have priority access to the centre whilst TCAT is committed to a significant programme of improvements including rebuilding the original farmhouse and major investment in outdoor equipment and facilities. Applications are being sought for residential staff to ensure the centre is open all year round. Howard Platt of Laskey Farm in

Lymm, who is the chair of TCAT, said: "As a former Lymm Grammar School student, I have very happy memories of staying at Ty'n-y -Felin back in the 1960s and 70s. It is such a great facility, and we at TCAT are very excited about being able to extend its use to more school students from Warrington, and to contribute to improving the facilities and activities it can provide.

As a condition of entering into a lease with the LGS Trust TCAT will :-

- Invest £200k in rebuilding the original farmhouse
- Recruit a full-time resident centre manager
- Invest up to £500k in new outdoor facilities
- Offer a wide choice of activities for young people of all ages
- Open Tyn Y Felin all year round

Villagers keep alive ancient tradition of

 ${\bf LOCAL}$ dignitaries and villagers turned out to celebrate the ancient medieval tradition of Lymm Rushbearing.

Lymm Parish Council Chair Ann Johnstone was joined by new MP for the village Esther McVey, who was experiencing her first Lymm Rushbearing event.

The event is organised each year by local resident Chris Limb who helped revive it in the 1980s.

For many years in the twentieth-century Rushbearing Monday was a local bank holiday. Ormerod's late Victorian history of

Cheshire refers to Lymm Rushbearing taking place in many communities on or near to the feast of the parish's on of near in the reason in the parish's patron saint – hence Lymm's tradition of having the festival during the summer holiday period and close to the feast of the Assumption of Saint

Although the carrying of fresh rushes to church (normally on a horse-drawn cart) was a central feature, and the replacement of the old rushes upon the earthen church

floor a very practical necessity in former days, this gathering of locals also involved festivities including not only the procession and Morris dancing but also sports, fairground stalls, and very full public houses!

Lymm's grey horses were well-known and a Lymm Grey is a person of an established local family, normally at least third generation born in Lymm.

The procession includes Morris men, people carrying Rushbearing garlands and rushes, the Chairman of the Parish Council and councillors, the May Queen and various local

It is medieval in its origins and Lymm is one of a very small number of communities that have maintained this tradition

Following the traditional walk with rushes through the village, a special service took place at St Mary's

Pensions on Divorce

Pensions are often one of the largest assets in a marriage, sometimes exceeding the value of the family home. Understanding how pensions are treated in divorce proceedings, the legal options available and the factors influencing division is crucial for ensuring a fair settlement.

There are 3 possible methods of settlement available with respect to pensions, namely Pension Sharing, Offsetting and Attachment (Earmarking), or a combination of Sharing and Offsetting.

A Pension Sharing Order allows for a percentage share of one spouse's pension to be transferred to the other party as a pension. This is a clean break option, meaning once the order is implemented the parties' pension assets are entirely separate. The receiving party may be able to join the other party's pension scheme or the funds may need to be transferred out to a new scheme of their choice.

Pension offsetting involves setting off the value of the pension against the value of other marital assets. For instance, one spouse may keep the pension while the other receives a greater share of the family home or other assets. This approach avoids the complexities of splitting a pension but requires sufficient nonpension assets to ensure a fair settlement.

Pension Attachment Orders, also known as earmarking, direct that a percentage share of one spouse's pension benefits be paid to the other when the pension comes into payment. This can include lump sum payments, regular pension income, or both. However, this option doesn't provide a clean break and the receiving party has no access to the funds until the pension holder's benefits become payable. This is not a very common option.

The first step in dividing pensions is to obtain a cash equivalent valuation (CEV). A CEV can be fairly straightforward for some types of pensions but more difficult to determine with respect to others. Given the complexity of pension division, seeking professional advice in the context of your specific circumstances is essential.


