Wood is good for carpenter Jensen

'MIGHTY oaks from little acorns grow' perfectly sums up a talented young carpenter from Warrington who has started a new business venture, specialising in his own wooden creations, during his summer work experience.

Wood is definitely good for 17-year-old Jensen Butterworth, from Whittle Hall in Great Sankey, who has used his college break to learn more about the confirmation. to learn more about the craftwork and skill he loves so much. Jensen's new business comes after spending valuable time with Meraki Woodcraft, a Sankey Bridges company that specialises in unique sustainable bespoke furniture. The young entrepreneur hasn't let the grass grow under his feet and has just launched JB Wood Creations Warrington featuring his own wooden garden accessories and planters.

"I'm currently studying for an NVQ Level 2 in carpentry and joinery at Warrington and Vale Royal College. I wanted to get more hands-on experience throughout the summer months. With the help of Meraki, I have set up my own business." Jensen added: "Initially, I began with three sizes of planters, but now make them to any size. Recently, I've designed and built complementary items like trellises, bench seating and herb boxes to go with them. Under the tutorage of Meraki each of these items is made by me to a high standard."

Jensen is helping the planet
by sticking to using sustainable
materials. "This is really important,

only around 8% of all the wood used in the world comes from a responsible source so I ensure that everything is made using sustainable materials with FSC accreditation. If the material doesn't come from a sustainable

source, then I won't buy it".
"Wood is a great natural resource which is both renewable and a material that is tactile to touch." said Jensen. "It's good to work with as no two pieces look the same. When I was younger, I liked to build things, my grandad also worked in the joinery business, so I guess my interest in wood stems from here.

His tutorage at Meraki has been invaluable. Tucked under the wings of its founder David Cross, Jensen has been shown how to design, build, cost and market his new work. "I still have a lot of things work. "I still have a lot of things to learn, like the financial side of things and I'm sure this will come with time," he added. "Ideally, I'd like to continue with joinery and grow the JB Wood Creations business, I'm aware that as we move into Autumn and Winter that the requirement for garden items will become less frequent, but this will give me an opportunity to design new items such a bin stores and log sheds which will help to

expand my skills".

And what does the future hold for this enterprising young man? Jensen replied: "Having the opportunity to start my own business at such a young age means a lot. It's not just about new joinery skills, its about taking responsibility for my future and learning skills that could last a lifetime. Ideally, I'd like to grow my business further with the view to it becoming a full-time enterprise when I finish college. I am certainly proud of what I am achieving and I'm sure it gives my dad and grandad something to be proud about too.

Former Wolves player who built a multi-million pound business gives back to charity that helped him

A FORMER Warrington Wolves player who built a multi-million-pound business after receiving a loan from The Prince's Trust is now an official mentor for the youth charity.

Jamie Boyd borrowed £3,000 from The Prince's Trust to start a same-day courier business after a devastating injury ended his professional rugby career in 2005.

Almost two decades later, Today Team now operates nationwide out of Taylor Business Park in Risley – and is on track to turn over £3m this financial year

financial year.
"The Prince's Trust offered me a lifeline after the lowest moment in my career," said Jamie, 43, who grew up in Great Sankey and attended St. Gregory's Catholic High School. "I was 24 years old with a busted knee and no money in the bank. I used the loan to lease a van and put in 60-hour weeks to build a business that now has top-

build a business that now has top-tier clients all over the UK.

'I am delighted to have now deepened my commitment to The Prince's Trust by becoming an official mentor. Being able to give back to the charity and help young people, who are setting up their tirst enterprise, is a great 'full circle'

moment."
At The Prince's Trust, mentoring is defined as the provision of personal support, assistance, encouragement and inspiration to encouragement and inspiration to young people during and following the charity's programmes – usually at a time of transition and over a sustained period.

The charity has designed a Personal Development Plan to allow the mentee and mentor to set goals and measure progress during their

the mentee and mentor to set goals and measure progress during their regular check-ins.

"I started my playing career with Crosfields ARLFC – and Rugby League taught me an awful lot," said Jamie, who now sponsors the team. "Coming from a single-parent family, I benefited from having the coaches and other players' parents around me. around me

'Having been brought up in that supportive environment, I am a big believer in the learning that can come from someone who has more experience and is willing to share it. Over the years, I've built up a strong network that allows me to do just that whenever I hit a roadblock in business, and I'm finding it very fulfilling to now be that person for the young people I mentor."

The Prince's Trust approached

Jamie about becoming a mentor

after he shared his inspiring story at an enterprise day, held at Beehive Mill in Ancoats, last year. His engaging talk, '10 Things I Wish I'd Known on Day One', became the catalyst for his official

"The charity knew I was interested in mentoring, they thankfully opened the door for me – and the rest is history," added Jamie. "I'm proud that I've gone from being a 'one man and his van' operator to a nationwide business, helping a '70 delivery partners, earn

to a nationwide business, helping up to 70 delivery partners earn a living every day. With Today Team growing, I am happy and grateful to now be able to invest time in building mentorship relationships that help young people whose shoes I was once in."

Warrington ranked second best place in UK for job opportunities

NEW research has revealed Warrington as the second best place in the UK for the best job opportunities.

The study, conducted by HR software provider Ciphr, compared employment data for 100 of the UK's most populated towns and cities to determine which locations offer the

determine which locations ofter the best potential for job opportunities. Warrington came in second place, behind Winchester and ahead of St Albans in third. Chelmsford, Sevenoaks, Preston, Cheltenham, Guildford, Aberdeen, and Reading also made the top 10.

Commenting on the findings Warrington Chamber of Commerce CEO Stephen Fitzsimons said: "Warrington appearing so highly in this study is of no surprise to anyone in the local business community. The town is home to a large number of town is home to a large number of international brands, each offering exciting career opportunities, both for residents and the daily influx of regional talent. From nuclear physicists to caring for the vulnerable – Warrington has a variety of vocations for all levels of aspiration and remuneration." and remuneration.

Towns and cities were rated (out of 100) across multiple factors, such as average full-time earnings, annual pay growth, the latest employment and unemployment figures, employment rate growth, the number of job listings on Indeed, LinkedIn and Glassdoor (combined) per

10,000 local workers, and business density – or the number of businesses

Housing costs, as well as life satisfaction and happiness scores, were also considered to reflect the town or city's affordability and its residents' general level of wellbeing.

Warrington scored well across multiple criteria – it has a below-

average unemployment rate of 2.8% and an above-average employment rate of 80.2% (the UK averages, for the year to December 2023, were 3.7% and 75.7% respectively).

the year to December 2023, were 3.7% and 75.7% respectively).

For those job hunting right now, analysis of data from Indeed, LinkedIn and Glassdoor, earlier this month, found that there were 472 job postings in Warrington per 10,000 working-age residents (the UK average is 243 per 10,000).

In 2023, the number of employers in Warrington, with 10 staff or more, increased by 4.8% (vs 2.2% nationally), taking its tally to 75.1 businesses per 10,000 working-age adults (that's above the UK average of 70.2 per 10,000).

The town is also relatively competitive in terms of housing affordability. Rental properties in Warrington averaged £695 a month in 2023 – just under a quarter (24%) of full-time pay. While, according to Rightmove, properties sold for an average of £262,694 in the last year – around 7.6 times the average full-time worker's earnings of £34,400.

Chamber endures changes in business community over 25 years

It's been an honour to work in Warrington for nearly as long as Warrington Worldwide and I'm part of the "born or drawn here" contingent. I still call junction 8 of the M62 the "new one", remember the Halliwell Jones stadium being shiny new and recall when Warrington Market had more meat stalls than anyone could possibly require!

The business community has changed significantly during this time, and although some might lament the demise of the town's industrial pioneers, you can still see their successors if you know where to look.

to look.

Greenall's might have moved gin production from Wilderspool to Birchwood, however they are still exporting around the world as part of Quintessential Brands. The Crosfield name has gone, but you can still find Ecovyst and PQ Silicas producing speciality chemicals at the same bend of the River Mersey. Wire production seems to live on only through Warrington Wolves, until you hear that companies such as Graepels of Burtonwood continue to produce mesh and cages, including for a James Bond villain!

It might be more difficult to see the Warrington economy in action (or smell - Tetley Walkers anyone?), however rest assured that it has evolved into one of the strongest in the North of England. Of course, logistics companies will always gravitate here because of the three motorways, West Coast Mainline and two international airports (which we have annexed for "Greater" Warrington). It's also worth highlighting that companies like Amazon have highly

sophisticated engineering jobs supporting automation and robotics so not always justified as low value. However, the real strength in the local economy is through the intellectual capital generated from the (nuclear) engineering companies at Birchwood Park - Sellafield, Jacobs, Rolls Royce, Nuvia and many others.

One organisation has of course endured throughout my time in Warrington and all the way back to its launch in 1876. The Chamber of Commerce has survived a Great Recession, two world wars and a global pandemic. It continues to provide the documentation for local manufacturers to send their products all over the world. It works with local and national politicians to ensure that their challenges and opportunities are incorporated into government policy. As you'll see again at the 11th October Warrington Businesse Conference, it brings businesses together to network, lobby and learn from each other. Many of us might be out to pasture in another 20 years, however the Chamber will still be here - financially secure and supporting local companies, together with the Business Exchange and Warrington & Co. Lit Fest is a big hit!

WARRINGTON'S biannual festival of literature, 'Lit Fest', has been hailed a big success, with almost 1,000 people discovering the joys of reading during this year's month-long celebration.

Newly released figures from Lit Fest 2024, which took place throughout June, show that over 700 people attended the headline events, with a further 200 people dropping into community libraries to take part in festival-themed activities.

Launched in 2022, organised by LiveWire, the festival runs at libraries and other community venues across the borough, showcasing a range of exciting literature-themed events exciting and activities.

This year's Lit Fest featured a range of different events for the whole community, aimed at promoting reading for pleasure, and welcoming both regular and new visitors into Warrington's libraries.

With four separate themed weeks children; culture and inclusivity; local authors; and crime reading' there was something for everyone, from storytelling and rhyme-times, to author talks, performance and workshops. Highlights

of the festival included:

Firefighter Storytime' with Cheshire Fire and Rescue Service at Great Sankey Hub, which was attended by more than 100 people.



Pensions on Divorce

Pensions are often one of the largest assets in a marriage, sometimes exceeding the value of the family home. Understanding how pensions are treated in divorce proceedings, the legal options available and the factors influencing division is crucial for ensuring a fair settlement.

There are 3 possible methods of settlement available with respect to pensions, namely Pension Sharing, Offsetting and Attachment (Earmarking), or a combination of Sharing and Offsetting.

A Pension Sharing Order allows for a percentage share of one spouse's pension to be transferred to the other party as a pension. This is a clean break option, meaning once the order is implemented the parties' pension assets are entirely separate. The receiving party may be able to join the other party's pension scheme or the funds may need to be transferred out to a new scheme of their choice.

Pension offsetting involves setting off the value of the pension against the value of other marital assets. For instance, one spouse may keep the pension while the other receives a greater share of the family home or other assets. This approach avoids the complexities of splitting a pension but requires sufficient nonpension assets to ensure a fair settlement.

Pension Attachment Orders, also known as earmarking, direct that a percentage share of one spouse's pension benefits be paid to the other when the pension comes into payment. This can include lump sum payments, regular pension income, or both. However, this option doesn't provide a clean break and the receiving party has no access to the funds until the pension holder's benefits become payable. This is not a very common option.

The first step in dividing pensions is to obtain a cash equivalent valuation (CEV). A CEV can be fairly straightforward for some types of pensions but more difficult to determine with respect to others. Given the complexity of pension division, seeking professional advice in the context of your specific circumstances is essential.

Good news for Warrington A Level students

THE recent publication of the 2024 A-level results has brought good news for Warrington students.

While the overall pass rate (A* – E grades) has fallen by 0.2% to 97.9%, the percentage of students achieving A* - E grades remains higher than the England average.

The ground source heat pump is an electric powered heating system that uses a series of boreholes to capture renewable energy from the ground.

This energy is compressed into a higher temperature so that it can heat Walton Hall to 21 degrees during cooler weather.

works included decommissioning and removing the old gas boilers and stripping out the existing heating system and pipework, before installing the new heating technology.

Replacing the end-of-life boilers is part of the council's work to shift from conventional fossil fuel heating.

from conventional fossil fuel heating in buildings to greener methods. This low-carbon heating technology will result in an estimated annual carbon saving of 43,000 kgCO2e, compared to gas heating.





Understanding Business Splitting: VAT Registration Implications

The VAT registration threshold increased from £85,000 to £90,000 on 1 April 2024, following a six-year freeze. This means businesses must register for VAT if their taxable sales exceed £90,000 over any rolling twelvemonth period or are expected to exceed this amount within the next 30 days. Registration would then be effective from the start of that thirty-day period.

Business splitting is a strategy some businesses use to avoid registering for VAT, especially when their sales are standard-rated, and customers cannot reclaim input tax. For example, a business that sells ice creams and rents deckchairs might consider operating the ice cream sales as a sole trader venture and the deckchair rentals as a limited company, keeping each entity under the threshold, even if their combined turnover exceeds £90,000.

HMRC's Powers and Legislation

HMRC has the authority to issue a written direction to treat two or more closely connected entities as a single taxable entity for VAT purposes. This is based on their assessment of the financial, organisational, and economic links between the entities. HMRC must prove the existence of all three types of links before they can issue a direction.

The relevant legislation is found in Schedule 1, paragraph 1A(1) of

the Value Added Tax Act 1994. Its purpose is to prevent the artificial separation of business activities that would otherwise result in VAT avoidance. HMRC's powers are designed to counter businesses deliberately splitting their operations to fall below the registration threshold.

A Case Study: Splitting in Practice

Consider a business owner who operates a garden maintenance service as a sole trader while running a limited company that provides fencing installation, paving, and irrigation services. While each business trades below the £90,000 threshold, their combined turnover exceeds this figure. The argument for separating the two entities is that one business maintains existing features while the other creates new installations.

HMRC can only issue a direction to combine businesses going forward and cannot enforce retrospective registration if the split is legitimate and well-structured. For the split to be properly executed, several factors must be in place:

- Separate bank accounts, supplier accounts, and sales invoicing for each business.
- 2. Customers must clearly understand which business they are dealing with.
- Separate marketing efforts, ideally with distinct websites and promotional materials.

- 4. Separate accounting records and systems for both businesses.
- 5. Different ownership structures, such as involving a spouse or other family member in one entity
- Clear distinction in activities, such as maintaining gardens versus installing new features.
- Transactions between businesses must be conducted at arm's length, with appropriate recharges for shared costs.
- 8. Financial independence between the businesses, with no loans or asset transfers between them.

If there is a lack of clear separation, such as shared equipment or muddled accounting between the businesses, HMRC may determine that no genuine separation exists. This could result in retrospective registration, potentially going back up to 20 years, which could have severe financial consequences for the business.

Guidance and Best Practices

Although HMRC does not provide a detailed checklist for identifying financial, organisational, or economic links, their decisions are typically based on common business practices. HMRC's Statement of Practice 4, issued in 1983, outlines factors that could

indicate a connection between entities. Despite the considerable case law that has emerged since, this guidance remains relevant.

Conclusion

In the case of the garden maintenance and fencing businesses, there may be a valid argument for business separation due to the distinct nature of the services offered, the customer bases, and the materials used. However, each case must be considered individually, and the separation must be genuine to avoid issues with HMRC. Business owners considering splitting should ensure they have the proper procedures in place to maintain clear separation between their entities, mitigating the risk of VAT complications.

Football in Warrington 25 years on

AS the first edition of printed version of Warrington Worldwide hit the streets 25 years ago the town's football teams were in the first weeks of the 1999/2000 season, a season which saw, as now, Warrington Town as the town's leading club, but only

Plying their trade in the North West Counties League Division Two, 5 levels lower than their Current home the National League North, which did not exist in 1999, Town had finished the 1998/99 season in 4th place 6 places above cross town rivals Tetley Walker who finished the 1999/00 season two places higher than Town, the last time a Warrington team has finished a season above Town and the first time it happened since Rylands finished the 1981/82 Mid-

Cheshire League season higher.
The following season 2000/01 saw Town and Tetley's battling for the NWCFL Division Two title with Town coming out on top finishing two points ahead of Tetley's in

second place.

Going in very different directions this is where the two teams parted company; Tetley Walker folded following the completion of the season due to ground issues with the Social Club, while Town began their rise up the non-league payramid system

pyramid system.
After three three seasons After infee seasons lown regained their place in the Northern Premier League, which had been lost in 1997. After 12 seasons in the NPL First Division they gained promotion to the Premier Division and last summer after seven seasons were promoted to the National League North where they enjoyed a good debut season finishing in a

a good debut season infishing in a respectable 12th place. A level to which Warrington Rylands will be aiming to follow them in time after a remarkable rise through the divisions which has seen them jump from the Cheshire League to the NPL Premier in four

years. In 1999 Warrington Rylands, or just Rylands as they were then

known, finished 8th in the Mid-Cheshire League Division One, a division which also included Warrington Borough Reserves).
Three further Warrington based

Inree turther Warrington based teams - Padgate St Oswalds, Rylands Reserves, Walkers Sports (Tetley Walker reserves) were competing in the Mid-Cheshire League Division Town, while today the only Warrington representatives in the Cheshire League (competition renamed in 2007) are Eagle Sports in the Premier Division and Moore in the Premier Division and Moore

United in League Two.

Back in 1999, Eagle Sports
were one of the leading clubs in
the Warrington & District Football
League. The 3rd oldest league in the country having been formed in 1895 housed 60 teams playing in 4 divisions, with a number of teams entering reserve teams in reserve divisions.

In 2024 the Warrington District League comprised 46 teams, including reserve teams, in 4 divisions and like in 1999 many of its teams come from outside the town boundaries as highlighted by the league champions, in 1999 Whiston Cross lifted the Premier Division title while St Helens based Sidac Sports took the 2024 title. In 1999 there were another 60

teams, again many from outside Warrington, playing in the 6 divisions of the Warrington Sunday League; in 2024 there were just 15 teams in 2 divisions. Grange Valley were the 1999 Sunday champions and FC Sankey the 2024 champions.

Much has changed on the Warrington football scene in the 25 years of Warrington Worldwide; I wonder what changes the next 25 years will bring?


