The Culcheth, Croft & Glazebury ward Cllr. who resigned from the Labour party over the controversial plans for a gypsy/traveller transit site on his ward at Croft, has told Culcheth Life he will not be joining

the new group.

Describing himself as a "lone wolf" following his much-publicised fall-out with Labour, Cllr Johnson says the local electorate has told him they like the idea of him

told him they like the lace of mini-remaining "totally independent." Meanwhile regular readers will know we are fiercely independent here at **Culcheth Life** and our sister publications Warrington

Worldwide and Lymm Life, and while we welcome this additional Independent group to the corridors of power, we will treat them, and Cllr. Johnson, like all the other political parties as equals, reporting local news as factually as we can.

the controlling Labour Group having such a large majority it is unlikely to make any difference in voting patterns at the town hall, but having independents as a group or individuals, will give a fresh pair of eyes, with no political bias, on activities going on at the town hall.

I understand one of the key issues they will be keeping an eye

on is the ongoing debt and budget overspend.

To be fair to Labour the independent group members have already been given seats at the table, so hopefully they can get a meaningful voice and see first-hand

what is going on.



### MP visits eleven schools as part of **Parliament Week**

Charlotte Nichols, Labour MP for Warrington North spent UK Parliament Week visiting schools across her constituency to speak to children about her role as an MP and answer all of their varied questions.

Between Monday 18th and Friday 22nd November Charlotte visited eleven schools that invited her as part of UK Parliament Week, the annual series of events to inspire interest in democracy and encourage young people to engage with our democratic system and institutions.

Charlotte has educated school children about the role of an MP, about democracy and her everyday life. She has taken questions from students from what motivated her to become an MP to the budget, the environment, international issues, meeting celebrities, and even what is her tavourite dog breed (it's an Irish Setter!).

Charlotte said "It has been a privilege to be able to get around so many of our local schools and speak with the children, who ask such provocative and intelligent questions. They have been impeccably well-behaved and engaged, and made articulate and thoughtful contributions to our discussions. Many of our pupils have a keen interest in fairness, politics, the world around them and citizenship. Hopefully the visits this week will spark an interest in the many possible career routes ahead of them, which may even include

Parliament. It was great to see that the schools have their own School Councils, have fun and inclusive clubs covering environmental issues and are engaging with parents and the local community on local issues about road safety, litter, recycling and online safety.

"As well as helping them know more about our country and how it is run, I have also

learned from them, hearing their important perspectives on how our decisions affect their lives. We have discussed their views on smartphones and social media, so they have a voice in how we shape the' legislation to keep them safe. It is vital that we understand how this impacts their homework and other learning that involves screentime; their personal safety when travelling to and from school, and ability to contact trusted grown-ups in an emergency; and whose responsibility it is to make sure they have a safe experience online. The children also offered opinions on at what age they thought certain apps should be available, and if games should change how others can contact each other online.

"It is not only as citizens of tomorrow that it is important to involve children, but also to include them in our debates of today. They have given me much to think about as I return to Westminster to continue championing the needs of everyone in Warrington North, regardless of age."

### Dog fouling no laughing matter

INDEPENDENT councillor Neil Johnson says helping local residents to tackle an epidemic of dog fouling in Croft is one of his absolute top priorities.

Neil has been out and about

Neil has been out and about in Croft, where he rolled up his sleeves and helped to bag and bin as much dog fouling as he could find!

Neil said: "Dog fouling is no laughing matter. We have a bit of an epidemic in Croft at the moment which local residents are rightly raising concerns about. It can spread diseases and even cause blindness in children if they get it in their eyes.

"Over the weekend, I've spoken face to face with everyone who has contacted me about this issue. I've also been out and about helping to clear up some of the mess myself –

it's not a nice job, but someone has got to do it!

"There is a particular problem on the field near the youth centre. What I am now trying to do is persuade the Council to install more dog waste bins and signs in the village. Extra dog waste bags have been made available to the public but there could be more. The issue will be discussed at the next Parish Council meeting and I will be there to support any residents who have concerns.

"In the meantime I am calling on all dog owners to act responsibly and clean up after their pets. Residents can let me know if there are any areas of the village that are badly affected by fouling and I will go there personally to help clean them up."

If you are having a real Christmas tree keep it away from heat sources and in a water holding stand to keep it fresh for longer.

- Natural food is at its scarcest at this time of year so keep your bird feeders stocked up at all times look after your feathered friends

- Improve the structure of clay soils by digging in plenty of bulky organic matter such as composted bark
- Remember to protect your half-hardy plants during very cold spells

### Plan for large industrial bin and bike store opposed

Councillor Independent Johnson is leading the charge against plans for a large scale industrial bin and bike store on the forecourt of the CPS Centre in Culcheth.

The landlords of the CPS Centre have submitted an application to build a large industrial size bin and bike storage on the forecourt overlooking the bus stop where Café Piccino currently have their outside seating. If the application is successful, it would mean that the café would lose (and its customers) would lose their outdoor seating which is well used throughout the

The unit would encompass six industrial size bins and 20 bike storage units.

Cllr. Johnson said "I am objecting to this planning application by the landlords of the CPS Centre. If this was successful, these industrial bins and bike storage units would be an eyesore in the middle of the village, in an area where people enjoy outdoor seating and often sit there to have their food and drink

"It would also be harmful to one of our great local businesses who use this area for their customers. To take away this valuable space seems spiteful and not very community spirited!

"There will also be problems with

smells and the bins are likely to attract anti-social behaviour in the evenings. It is totally inappropriate.

"I have put my objections forward and I am pleased that my fellow Borough Councillors and the Parish Council have followed my lead on this and have joined me in

objecting.
"We need the Labour councillors on the planning committee to refuse this application. I'm giving the local businesses my full backing in

opposing the plan."
