

Plans to revitalise walking and cycling routes are moving forward

WARRINGTON Borough Council's plans to revitalise walking and cycling routes across the borough are moving forward – with the latest improvements now under way.

The council is investing £450,000 of national Shared Prosperity Funding (SPF) to enhance around 25km of Warrington's network of active travel routes. A range of improvements will be taking place over the coming months at a number of locations, including the scenic Sankey Valley and Trans Pennine Trail.

Part of the council's wider

strategy to invest in sustainable transport – and building on several successful active travel projects already delivered in Warrington the latest investment aims to improve the condition of a number of routes and paths and encourage more people to walk, cycle, and wheel

The latest works are focusing on addressing surface deterioration, making improvements for disabled people and refreshing outdated signage, to make routes more accessible, safe and enjoyable for everyone.

The scope of the project includes a variety of improvements tailored to each location:

Path surface maintenance: Repairing worn-out s surfaces, particularly on the Trans Pennine Trail, to improve users' Trans experience.

• Improved accessibility: Installing dropped kerbs and replacing A-frames with more suitable features to accommodate people with disabilities and adapted cvcles.

Enhanced signage: Upgrading and replacing outdated signage to improve wayfinding and route

clarity.

Vegetation clearance and buffer creation: Removing encroaching vegetation and creating grass buffers to protect paths from future overgrowth.

Council leader and cabinet member for transport, Cllr Hans Mundry, said: "These improvements support our ongoing work to make it easier and more pleasant for people to walk, cycle, and wheel, in every part of our borough.

"We are targeting areas that we know are in need of improvement or are inaccessible to people with disabilities. By investing in this way, our aim is to build sustainable transport into everyday life in Warrington, promoting healthier and more active lifestyles, reducing reliance on cars and improving air quality. "I'm

delighted these latest



New cutting-edge blood testing clinic opens to provide fast health screening

A TEAM of entrepreneurs from Warrington are using cutting-edge blood testing technology to help with health screening for a huge range of conditions.

The BAPP Blood Analysis has opened its new lab and collection point located at Park Manor, Victoria Park, Warrington, once the town's maternity hospital and it offers hundreds of tests which can help flag anomalies in blood work empowering patients with the knowledge regarding their health status and seek further advice if

necessary. It's the brainchild of John Lyons, 38, a father of three children who lives in Warrington.

He began his career in business working for his family home removal business for more than 20 years but then aged 35 branched out and established his own company in health and fitness, Elements Cyro Spa on Knutsford Road.

With the blood testing facility, John identified an opportunity to further innovate in the healthcare sector. BAPP is intended to be a bridge connecting expert care with those in need of insightful health analysis. They provide a wide variety of blood tests with some tests having a turnaround time of less than I hour, empowering clients to take control of their health decisions.

Despite BAPP launching recently it's already borne results for a businessman in his early 30s after a blood test uncovered a life-changing health condition he was completely unaware of which had not been spotted in previous NHS blood tests.

Thanks to the quick speed and turnaround of blood tests, It has gained popularity amongst people needing blood tests who are having to wait longer to get a blood test due to current waiting times. BAPP aims to give answers to

people who have nagging worries about their health that won't go away. It could be unexplained fatigue, shortness of breath, or other niggles. The blood tests are not just about finding out if those who undertake them are unwell, but it's about catching potential health issues before they become more

severe.

After the success of Elements
Cryo Spa, John realised the
potential of blood screening and
the business was established with
partners Richard Sutton and Kevin
Tobin joining forces to fund the
technology. Both partners can see
the benefits of what the business
offers due to their own personal
experiences with their families and
health.

Bloods are taken by qualified phlebotomists in a pleasant facility and then analysed in a neighbouring laboratory with no public access. He said blood tests for hormones is a huge area of growth - both male and female hormones.

there's been interest in the prostate checks following cyclist Sir Chris Hoy's terminal diagnosis of advanced

prostate cancer.

John said: "We are trying to promote people being proactive about their health and we are helping to educate people with blood screening. I get a huge sense of job satisfaction from what I do. When I see people like Luke Perret, I think this is what we are doing it for. Some people may say £360 is a lot of money for blood tests. But if you look at it as a once-a-year thing that you get into the habit of, it's not really that much when you think about what you'd spend £360 on during the course of a year.

"We can do a cancer risk assessment and our genetics blood tests can test 94 different genes for any mutation and our genetics risk

any mutation and our cardio risk assessment looks at 100 genes. We

assessment looks at 100 genes. We have 200 different blood tests.

"And it can make a difference to people's lives. If somebody is found to be at a high risk of skin cancer, for example, then they may no longer use sun beds and would be more inclined to use a higher factor sun cream when out in the sun. They will start making necessary change's to prevent the condition."
He also believes it will help relieve

pressure on the NHS by offering an alternative service for the worried well or people who have a tendency well or people who have a tendency to overthink or worry about their health or symptoms. By having their blood tested privately and giving them piece of mind, they can free up vital appointments, he noted.

"There is no other service like this

in Warrington and our equipment

in Warrington and our equipment and laboratory is on site.

"We offer peace of mind for people who can learn more about their health through these tests. When I think about what's happened to Luke, he's now lost a couple of stone from what he found out from his blood test, he looks healthier and fitter and his skin and eyes are brighter from the changes he's are brighter from the changes he's made. We are genuinely making a difference to people's lives."
He said for their customers it's the

knowledge the blood tests empower them with, as they "don't have to wonder any more about their health. If they're lucky they are fine and happy. But the key is knowing your body and the changes.

"People may think they are ok but really they don't know for sure without these tests."

Since his journey began, John has worked hard to expand his knowledge and continuous learning gaining him numerous qualifications such as accredited phlebotomist, accredited in the application of cryosurgery, certified in the administration of cryotherapy and cpd accredited in skin anatomy and





Council reduces projected overspend by more than £8 million

WARRINGTON Borough Council's latest projection shows it has reduced the amount of a forecast £28.1 million overspend by more than £8 million.

At quarter 2 (July-September), the council was forecasting an overspend of £28.1 million. At period 7 (up to 31 October), the council is forecasting a reduced overspend of around £19.9 million.

Progress is being made across the council's departments to minimise the projected overspend. For example, families and wellbeing services (which account for children's and adult services, public health, education and SEND), have brought down their collective overspend projection by £2.2 million. The council has also seen an improved position across corporate finance.

More broadly, the council has been taking a number of measures to reduce expenditure. This includes limiting spend unless essential, holding vacancies

essential, holding vacancies and conducting a council-wide voluntary redundancy scheme.
Cabinet member for finance, assets and investments, Cllr Denis Matthews, said: "A £19.9 million projected overspend is still very circuiticant but the latest Cabinet. significant, but the latest Cabinét report demonstrates the progress we are making.



overspend reduction £8.2 million is an important step. I'm grateful to officers across the to not only deliver valuable services to residents despite demand increases, but also working to identify savings to help reduce our

overspend.
"We will keep doing everything possible to reduce the overspend turther. There will be some very difficult decisions ahead of us as we work to reduce our current £19.9 million projection, but we will keep working together to find solutions."

Luke Littler from teenage darts prodigy to household name

IN less than 12 months, Warrington teenager Luke Littler has gone from a darts prodigy with potential to a household name.

Littler was preparing for his second tilt at the PDC World Darts Championship and remarkably was entering the 2025 edition as favourite as Warrington Worldwide went to press went to press.

Last 'year, in his maiden tournament, Littler went all the way to the final, capturing the hearts of the nation as a 17-year-old going up against, and beating, darts biggest names before losing to Luke Humphries.

Despite the defeat, Littler has garnered more attention than the world number one all year, and has delivered on the big stage too - winning the Premier League title, an event that some suggested Littler shouldn't enter as it was too early in

his fledgling career. Now ranked number four in the world, Littler has won three major finals, including the Premier League and most recently, the Grand Slam of Darts. He also won in the World Series of Darts, and came out on top in the Bahrain Darts Masters and Poland Darts Masters competitions. interest His interest in tootball, particularly Manchester United and playing EASportsFC, has opened up further opportunities and captured people's attention too, while he was spotted in the crowd at Warrington Town's recent win over Hereford.

There is now talk that Littler's emergence may just be the first of many of his ilk. 12-year-old Jayden Walker hit the headlines this week after featuring in the televised MODUS Super Series' Influencer Darts Showdown, scooping a doubles title after beating Humphries in an exhibition.

Darts supremo Barry Hearn told Sky Sports: "These kids, it's their career. They actually know it's going to take them some time so

"They haven't got the pressure on them of someone else who's maybe got a wife, children, mortgages, all he usual pressures that exist. These kids haven't got that. They're just going at it like Luke Littler.

"So what are you going to do with your winnings? I don't know. I'm going to go home and play my Xbox. That's frighteningly

dangerous."
After being annihilated by Littler in the recent Grand Slam of Darts final, Martin Lukeman joked about He said: "He has a Boost bar, a meal deal and a curry, walks up there and smashes them in like that!"

There have often been jokes about Littler spending his winnings on 'FIFA points', the in-game currency of the EASportsFC PlayStation game that enables you to buy packs of cards for your team.

He has a further chance to add to his career earnings thanks to Village Hotels, who have offered to put up £60,000 for every ninedarter Littler hits at the Alexandra Palace later this month.

With Littler too young to be eligible for the nine-darter prize bonus put on offer by tournament sponsor's Paddy Power, Village Hotels have stepped up to ensure he doesn't miss out.

Littler became the Littler became the youngest player ever to hit a televised nine darter against Nathan Aspinall

darrer against Nathan Aspinali back in January, and then followed that up in the Premier League against Humphries in May. A Village Hotels spokesperson said: "What Paddy Power and the PDC have done in supporting Prostate Cancer UK through The BIGGER 180 campaign has been remarkable, and the nine-darter bonus promises to make this year's even bigger.

But given what Luke has done in the sport already, and our close bond developed with the PDC since joining as a partner, we couldn't see one of the biggest names miss out – so we wanted to do our bit.

"But if helps inspire Luke to hitting the magic number, and if it means more money goes to saving lives as

part of the wider campaign, then it'll be a small price to pay." Luke Littler met up with Warrington borough Council Chief Executive and Warrington Wolves' Deputy Chairman Prof. Steven Broomhead at the Village Hotel in Warrington.

Commenting on the rising star Prof. Broomhead said: "I enjoyed meeting Luke. I congratulated him on his continuing success, his positive advocacy for our town and his great support for the Wire. His success is truly remarkable. He is a really good role model for young people."

As we head into the New Year, we start with dealing with the 31st January self-assessment deadline and payments that are also due by 31st January 2025.

HMRC last year announced changes to the requirement to file tax returns, however for the 2023-24 tax year, self-assessment

remains a critical process for taxpayers with income or financial circumstances that are not covered by solely PAYE (Pay As You Earn) income. Individuals must complete a self-assessment tax return if they earned more than £1,000 from self-employment, received untaxed income such as rental earnings or dividends above the

£10,000 allowance, or had PAYE income over £150,000. Additional requirements include those liable for the High-Income Child Benefit Charge, individuals with foreign income, or those claiming certain tax reliefs, like pensions or charity donations.

The filing deadline is 31 January

How employers can manage rising National Insurance costs

From April 2025, employers will face significant cost increases due to changes in National Insurance Contributions (NIC). The Class 1 Employers' NIC rate will rise by 1.2%, bringing it to 15%, and the threshold at which employers must pay NIC on employee earnings will drop from £9,100 to £5,000. This change alone adds an extra £615 in costs per employee annually. Additionally, the NIC increase will apply to Class 1A and Class 1B contributions on benefits in kind reported on P11Ds, payrolled benefits, and PAYE Settlement Agreements.

To offset these rising costs, employers can consider salary sacrifice pension schemes, which remain a highly effective option. Under such a scheme, employees agree to exchange part of their salary for a direct employer pension contribution. This arrangement reduces taxable income, creating NIC savings for both employers, replacing salary with a NIC-free benefit translates into substantial savings.

Salary sacrifice schemes offer clear

advantages. Employees not only receive tax relief on their pension contributions but also save on their own NIC payments. Employers, meanwhile, benefit from a 15% saving (effective from April 2025) on the amount sacrificed. For instance, an employer with 100 employees earning £50,000 each could save £45,000 annually by introducing a salary sacrifice arrangement with an average contribution rate of 6%. Employers can also use this as a tool to attract and retain staff by sharing some of the savings with employees, such as increasing the employer pension contribution. Sharing the savings—commonly on a 50/50 basis—can enhance employee satisfaction while maintaining financial efficiency.

Another advantage of salary sacrifice is the flexibility it provides employees. Workers can waive bonuses in exchange for higher employer pension contributions, enabling them to save more for retirement. Additionally, by reducing taxable income, employees might avoid moving into higher income tax brackets, potentially saving more in the long term.

However, employers must carefully consider several factors before implementing or expanding a salary sacrifice scheme. Reducing an employee's gross pay through salary sacrifice could inadvertently bring lower-paid workers below the National Minimum Wage (NMW). Employers must ensure robust checks are in place to comply with NMW regulations. Furthermore, lower declared income may affect an employee's ability to secure loans or mortgages. Employers should clearly communicate these potential impacts to employees during the consultation process.

Salary-based benefits, such as life insurance, could also be affected by reduced pay. Employers need to assess how these might change under a salary sacrifice arrangement. Proper implementation is crucial, as employees must agree to the arrangement before it takes effect. Seeking professional advice ensures that the scheme is compliant and effective

In addition to pensions, employers can explore other salary sacrifice options, such as ultra-low emission vehicles (ULEVs) or cycle-to-work schemes. Although the savings from these may be smaller, they provide environmental and sustainability benefits, aligning with broader corporate goals. Employers should also review employee NIC categories to ensure proper treatment. For instance, apprentices under 25 are exempt from employers' NIC unless their earnings exceed £50,270.

With the NIC increase applying to Class 1A contributions on benefits, now is an ideal time to reassess the value of existing benefit packages. Employers might discover opportunities to switch providers or reduce costs while maintaining employee satisfaction.

Ultimately, while the increased NIC rate and reduced thresholds will drive up costs, employers can take proactive steps to manage the impact. A well-structured salary sacrifice pension scheme, combined with a review of other cost-saving measures, can help offset the financial burden while supporting employee benefits and retention strategies.
